## SPAIN WEAKENS.

Withdraws the Request for Fitz Hugh Lee's Recall From Cuba.

### THE PRESIDENT IS FIRM.

Warships Will Carry Supplies. Two Artillery Regiments, Fifty Millions for Defense. Enlisting Men at Brooklyn. Indignation Against Speaker Recd.

WASHINGTON, March 7.—Spain has withdrawn the request for the recall of Consul General Lee from Cuba.

The withdrawal came today in the shape of an official communication from Minister Woodford at Madrid. The prevalent opinion of those in authority at the Capital is that the refusal of the President to consent to General Lee's recall and the determination of the Secretary of the Navy to send the relief supplies to Cuba in naval vessels, as originally contemplated by the Department, adds serious features to the diplomatic complications already existing.

The determination of the President not to recall General Lee in accordance with the intimation from the Spanish minister of foreign affairs transmitted through Minister Woodford to that effect, is one that Spain cannot misunderstand.

Had Spain desired to press the matter she would have been compelled to take the initiative, and cancel the exequatur, or writ of commission, of the consul office. Such an unfriendly act would probably cause trouble.

Spain could have taken this step without declaring war and the President could have ignored it by not sending a successor to General Lee. In spite of the reports it was not thought that Spain would care to increase the tension already existing by insisting upon his recall.

It is understood that Spain's objection to Lee was on account of his utterances of sympathy for the sufferings of the Cubans.

The chairman of the House Military committee moved the passage, under a suspension of the rules, of the Hawley bill creating two additional regiments of artillery. The bill was passed with only three dissenting votes.

A bill was introduced appropriating fifty million dollars to be used at the discretion of the President in perfecting the national defenses.

Senator Hale of Maine, Chairman of the naval committee has finally suggested the advisability of purchasing any supplies necessary to the defense of the country.

HAVANA, March 7.—(Special).—The warship Alfonso XIII arrived from Spain today with twelve hundred soldiers.

It is surmised that the court of inquiry will not remain here much longer. The members of the court profess ignorance of the date set for departure.

Consul General Lee, on being questioned regarding Spain's request for his recall, said: "I shall continue to do my duty, which is to guard American interests. My son came to visit me during his short vacation. He has been here before and has friends here, and will return to the United States when his vacation is over. Mrs. Lee is not ill or nervous and I have written nothing to alarm her. There is no need of it."

Key West, March 7.—(Special).—Instructions have been sent to send the cruisers Nashville and Montgomery to Cuba with supplies as originally agreed. The order to send the Fern with supplies has been rescinded.

Brooklyn, March 7.—(Special).—Orders were received at the Navy Yard this morning to enlist men for the Navy without limit, except as to apprentices. Crowds applied at the offices by nine

### THE STATE CAPITAL.

Probable Establishment of State Textile School.

Two Prisoners Pardoned. Light Rainfall for February. Brick Pays to Manufacture. Argument in Stewart Bros. Case.

JOURNAL BUREAU. RALEIGH, N. C., March 7.

Governor Russell on Saturday pardoned two life prisoners from Halifax county. It is now said the testimony which convicted them was false and perjured. They have served five years of imprisonment.

The steady rain of Friday has been followed by beautiful weather almost spring like in its mildness.

Treasurer Worth has received affidavits that two of the alleged oyster claimants had been dead several years.

Much interest centres here in the marriages at "High Noon" on March 9th of ex-Congressman F. A. Woodard of Wilson to Mrs. R. E. Holloman of this city. Mrs. Holloman is the widow of Mr. W. H. Holloman of Raleigh one of the wealthiest men of the place. Her home here is one of the handsomest in the city. They will reside in Wilson.

During February only 42 hundreds of an inch of rain fell. This shows the intense dryness of the month. The average rain fall for February is about 4 inches. The main temperature for the month was 41 degrees which is about 3 degrees below the average.

The Superintendent of the penitentiary finds that the manufacture of brick pays and that work will be started again and on a much larger scale than ever before.

The proposition to establish a State Textile school in connection with the Agricultural and Mechanical College here, is meeting with so much encouragement that the proprietors say they will be able to place the matter plainly before the legislature next winter.

It is said that the name of South Carolina was not in the list of States in the order issued by Attorney General Griggs making the North Carolina penitentiary a Federal prison. South Carolina was said to be included, but that was a mistake. Virginia was left out, but has been added by a supplementary order.

The Supreme court has heard argument in the case of the State Treasurer against Stewart Bros., ex-Winston the ex-State printers. These suits were for about \$20,000 which Treasurer Werts says was collected by the Stewarts in excess of the real cost of work done.

Convicts are to grade the railroad from here to the Cape Fear river. It is hoped to have the road in operation by the end of July.

The railroad commission has set March 15th as the day for hearing argument on the exceptions of the railroads as to the reduced passenger rates. Very vigorous protests have been made by all the roads in the State.

Rehearsals for the Mikado are being held regularly. It is to be given by local talent under the training of Mr. Baker of Chicago for the benefit of the Ladies Hospital Aid Association.

### THE FIRST NEWS.

Double Request By Spain. A Firm Refusal by the United States.

WASHINGTON, March 6.—Senor Gullon, Spanish minister of foreign affairs, intimated to Minister Woodford that the Spanish government desires the recall of Consul-General Fitzhugh Lee from Havana.

Spain also requested that merchant vessels instead of warships be sent to convey supplies from the United States to Cuba.

The first intimation of these steps came in a brief and explicit cable dispatch from Madrid. Prior to its receipt, however, the authorities here had been fully conversant with the facts, although no intimation had been allowed to get to the public on either subject. The disclosures from Madrid left no further ground for reticence in Washington, and after a conference at the White House between the President, Assistant Secretary Day, of the State Department, and Secretary Long, of the Navy Department the following statement was made by Judge Day as comprising everything that was to be said by the administration on the subject:

"The President will not consider the recall of General Lee. He has borne himself throughout this crisis with judgment, fidelity and courage, to the President's entire satisfaction.

"As to the supplies for the relief of the Cuban people, all arrangements have been made to carry a consignment this week from Key West by one of the naval vessels, whichever may be best adapted and most available for the purpose, to Matanzas and Sagua."

There are circumstances which disclose the grounds for the recall, although it is not known that Spain has made any exact specifications of complaint. Since the Maine disaster a report has been circulated that General Lee held the personal opinion that the explosion was due to external cause. No official report of this character was ever sent to Washington so far as is known. But the mere circulation of the report at Madrid, attributing such views to General Lee, has been the source of much feeling in Spanish official circles.

The report that Spain has bought two warships in Great Britain and two in France is confirmed. It is understood in London that she is also likely to get the Chilean battle ship O'Higgins.
