WENT THE OTHER WAY.

Spain's Cape Verde Fleet Has Retreated to Cadiz.

IT IS A PITY

For Sampson's Fleet is Cruising Off Porto Rico.

And Hoped to Make an End to Spain's Navy. Spain Unprepared to Fight at Manila. Talk of Intervention Again. Mexico Unfriendly to Spain.

WASHINGTON, May 10.—Although ten days have elapsed since the Spanish ships left St. Vincent, and going at the rate of ten knots an hour they could by this time have covered the distance to San Juan, it now turns out that the Spanish fleet is not there at all.

Conjectures have been made by the naval authorities as to the whereabouts of the Cape Verde fleet. The official view was that the Spanish fleet was to the south of Porto Rico, at the Windward Islands and a battle was hourly expected to be heard from.

All these surmises will now have to be laid aside and new plans laid, if there is no mistake in the last reports, for according to official advices received tonight by the Navy Department the Spanish fleet has returned to Cadiz instead of braving the attack of Sampson's fleet as has been hoped they would do.

From Hong Kong it is reported that movements are taking place among the naval vessels of the foreign powers that suggests an intention of intervention by the powers in the Philippines. The situation at those islands is very serious for telegrams from Manila to Madrid, say that the insurgents have gotten beyond control of the authorities, and that they had attacked and killed many Spanish soldiers, among the killed being Admiral Montojo, who fought against the American vessels, and who was wounded in the fight.

The probable condition of the whole Spanish navy is shown by reports of the Manila engagement. According to reports from reliable sources many of the Spanish shells fired from their warships were uncharged and did not explode upon striking the American vessels. Several such shells passed through the flagship Olympia without exploding.

The fear that has struck to the heart of the commercial interests, has reached the fishing interests. The owners of an African fishing vessel have decided to abandon the fisheries on the New Foundland banks for fear of Spanish warships, reports of their presence in those waters being sent out from time to time.

Mexico has followed the other nations and now refuses to allow Spain to send any men or supplies of any kind through the Isthmus.

A report from China says that the British Consulate at Shanghai, in the Empire was burned by a mob.

At the churches in this city it is said that prayers be offered for the success of the American arms in the contest against Spain.

Keenly alive to the possibility of the United States transferring the Philippine Islands to another power, Europe is watching with intense interest the policy of this country with respect to their ultimate destination.

It can be stated on high diplomatic authority that rather than that the Philippines should become the possession of any other nation, provided they cannot be returned to Spain, Europe, as a whole, prefers that they shall remain the property of the American government. A high State Department official who keeps in close touch with the President, said today:

"One thing is certain. If the United States does not retain possession of all of the islands it will keep a coaling station in the Far East for the benefit of American warships and American commerce."
Dewey's Orders.
Washington, May 10.—The orders sent to Commodore Dewey to proceed after his own fashion in accomplishing the task which the department had set for him.

Here is the text of the orders:
Washington, April 24, 1898.
Dewey, Hong Kong, China:
War has commenced between the United States and Spain. Proceed at once to Philippine Islands. Commence operations at once, particularly against the Spanish fleet. You must capture vessels or destroy them. Use utmost endeavors.

THE STATE CAPITAL.

Mustering and Examining New Men For The Army. No Great Expense to State For Mobilizing Troops

RALEIGH, N. C., May 10.
Captain Gresham the mustering army officer has sent the different surgeons off to different places to examine the negro volunteers. This is done with two objects in view. One to save the government expense in sending back home the rejected ones and the other is so that immediately upon their arrival at Fort Macon they can be mustered into service.

Out on the parade ground yesterday the soldiers had a regimental drill and dress parade. There were crowds of ladies there, and quite a large number of the business men here. The officers say that it is hard to bring the boys down to regular camp life when they are so near home.

The L. O'B. Branch camp Confederate Veterans at a meeting last night offered itself as a home guard. It will bring up its number to 81 men.

Capt. Gresham the mustering officer has received a telegram saying the Governor can appoint the officers to the colored battalion, so his first appointment of colored officers holds good. In the colored battalion there will be but 206 men including officers.

The 1st Regiment did not go to Memorial exercises today. Capt. Thorp of Nash county introduced the orator Col. W. H. Burgwyn.

During the memorial ceremonies a flag was presented by Mrs. Branch the widow of Gov. Branch to the L. O'B. Branch of Confederate Veterans.

Governor Russell is criticized for the appointment of Adjutant Dan Johnson of Wilmington. It is said he is totally unfit for the position, but he is a nephew of the Governor's.

It is said this morning that the 1st Regiment will be sent to Tampa instead of to Chickamauga. This will be done as soon as they are equipped, but scarcely under a week.

The Healdville and Oxford companies will consolidate. The Murphy and Lenoir county companies will be ordered here to complete the 2nd Regiment.

The cost of the mobilization of the troops as far as the State is concerned will not be \$1,000. This being mainly for the duty pay of officers who arranged the mobilization.

A company of the 2nd Regiment from Burlington came in today and tomorrow 7 more will come in.

Dr. B. F. Dixon has been appointed as one of the Majors of the Second Regiment.
