Another Account.

PORT-AU-PRINCE HAYTI, June 6 -It s reported here that the American squadron forced an entrance into San tiago de Cuba harbor today, that the Cristobal Colon and another Spanish vessel were sunk and that one of the American vessels, whose name is unknown, was blown up.

The Americans landed a number of troops east of Santiago, at Punta Gorda. They are believed to have made a junction with the insurgents nearby, who, with the fleet, continued to storm the batteries and earthworks surrounding Santiago.

Advices published in Le Matin today state that great a demonstration in honor of Cervera and the fleet were held in Santiago May 22. There were illuminations and patriotic songs in the streets and a banquet to the Admiral and his officers at the Casino.

Cervera found about 4,000 tons of coal in Santiago. He will need for his fleet 5,500 tons. Provisions are scarce and the insurgents have cut off communications with the interior.
