### SITUATION AT HAVANA.

Far Apart as to the Date of Evacue

HAVANA, Cuba, October 18 .- The two ssions are today as far as ever from agreement concerning the date of the final evacuation of Cuba.

Last week the Spanish commi nnounced that it would be impossible to withdraw all the troops before January 15, which date it was then believed would be agreed upon. Misunderstandings arose and now the commissions are so far apart that an agreement between them seems unlikely. Colonel Girauta today said the situation would probably be referred back to the governments in Washington and Madrid.

No confidence is put in reports from Paris that Sagasta has ordered Blance not to evacuate Cuba until the Philip pine question is settled. The American point to the complete plans of Cuba's defenses placed in their hands by General Blanco, as evidence of the Span lards' honorable intentions.

More than that, Spanish troops are syacuating the Island as rapidly as possible considering the ships at their command. Orders have been given for the immediate evacuation of Puerto Principe. This means that shortly after No vember 1 all the Eastern provinces will be under American control.

Many influential Spaniards believe Cuba will be forced to accept annexation because of the jealousies among the in surgent lea lers.
