The rule of Russellism need not be confined to Wilmington, New Berne and Greenville, for with an election favorable to Republican-Populist fusion, the same fate can be visited upon Greensboro, Charlotte and Winston.

Therefore the decision on November 8th, is one which involves the future destiny of the white people of the entire State.
