FOR EXPANSION.

Little Doubt That the President is Committed to That Policy. Many Favor It.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 28.—Disguise as to the ultimate administration policy with reference to the late Spanish dependencies has been more or less apparent in all the months which have intervened since the declaration of hostilities. The veil has, however, become gradually thinner and thinner, until now there is but little left of it. Today what is practically a semi-official announcement was made that the United States will hold on to all the territories it has conquered. This is construed, and properly, as including all of the Philippines.

Under all the circumstances as now existing no reasonable doubt can rest in the mind of any one that the President has determined to give the weight of his name, his power and his influence to the adoption of a vast and far-reaching colonial policy. The whole question has now reached such an acute stage that if the President is not standing on the lines attributed to him, it is manifestly incumbent upon him and demanded of him to make an official declaration to that effect. President McKinley has always been regarded as a cautious, conservative man, but he is a man also who, when resolved, is apt to be as radical as any one, especially if he is convinced of a following behind him. Some of the best minds of the country are viewing with apprehension and dismay the prospect unfolding before us. Yet it would be folly to deny that much of the ambition, the ability and the political sagacity of both parties is committed to the scheme of outlying possessions. Even in a democratic or opposition House there are found to be men, and men who can make their influence felt, in sympathy with administration views in this respect.

Teresa Maria Sunday.

CAMANERA, Cuba, October 28.—The raised Spanish cruiser Infanta Maria Teresa will sail Sunday morning for New York. The Cincinnati, Leonidas Polanco will convey her to Cape May. She goes to the outer harbor tomorrow.

Just three months ago today, the gunboat Sandoval was sunk by the Spaniards to prevent the Americans from capturing her. She made a satisfactory trial trip this morning and is ready for service. Like the Teresa, she has been raised and repaired.

Williams Near Jerusalem.

JAFFA, PALESTINE, Oct. 28.—Emperor William and Empress Augusta Victoria, of Germany, were warmly welcomed on their arrival here yesterday after a hot and tiring eight hour drive from Haifa. They proceeded today on horseback to their camp at Babolwad and expect to reach Jerusalem Saturday.

Cunningham's own county, Person, stood by him faithfully. An excursion train all decorated came in on Thursday morning from there bringing 1,000 people. The Fair and all its galleries are at an end. The Marshals Ball last night was a lovely one. Chief Marshal Drowry, gave to each maid of honor, and to each lady present at the Ball a beautiful souvenir hat pin. It was silver, in the shape of a shepherd's crook, with "Marshals Ball 1898" on it.

Col. Waring Dead.

NEW YORK, October 29.—Col. George Waring, one of the best known citizens of New York, a former public officer, died of yellow fever this morning.

Col. Waring devised the drainage system in vogue at Memphis after the yellow fever epidemic of 1878, which has been adopted by every American and European city. He is known for reviving the system of street cleaning in New York. He arrived from Havana with the disease Wednesday. Col. Waring's visit to Cuba was for the purpose of investigating the sanitary condition for the government and of making it first class.

UNTIL JANUARY FIRST.

Spaniards Allowed Until Then to Leave Cuba. The Reason.

WASHINGTON, October 29.—The formal decision of the President and Cabinet to extend the time first given the Spanish troops to get out of Cuba to January 1st was not satisfactory, but it could not very well be avoided. This government could, of course, order impossibilities, but that would not get them performed. Our military commissioners now at Havana believe that the Spaniards are getting out of Cuba in good faith and as fast as they could reasonably be expected to do with the facilities at their disposal. There are so many troops to be carried to Spain, and there are only so many ships available to carry them, and it takes an average of just so many days to make a round trip. It thus became a question of mathematics. There will be more Spanish troops left in Havana December 1 than this government cares to have there when our troops take charge, therefore it has been considered best to defer taking possession for a month after date. This decision was not the result of anything but existing conditions, as reported by our Commissioners.

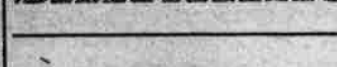
