QUIET RETURNING.

Negroes and White Leaders Banished
From the City. Military Given
Necessary Protection.

WILMINGTON, November 11.—Every-
thing is now quiet. The town was pat-
rolled last night by armed men and but
for the feeling of expectancy everybody
rested easy.

There are three military companies
here now and they will preserve order.
Business has been partially resumed.

This morning ten of the negro leaders
were taken from the jail and banished
from the city and several of the white
leaders of negroes were banished.

Geo. Z. French, acting sheriff of the
county, was notified to leave. He took
the 7.15 train on the Atlantic Coast Line
with the agreement never to return.
The railroad men gave him protection
and he was accompanied outside of the
city by ten armed men.

A. W. Scott, a negro lawyer, who is
considered as partially responsible for
the rioting was escorted by five white
citizens to the south bound train and
given specific orders never to return to
Wilmington under any circumstances in
the future.

Chief of Police John R. Melton, C. H.
Gilbert of the street force and R. H.
Buning a Republican magistrate, were
taken to the city limits by men armed
with Winchester. They were not given
time to change their clothes and were
put on the New Berne train at half past
two in the afternoon and ordered not to
come back. There may be more to follow
and those that left were required to take
an oath never to return.

The Kingston Naval Reserves arrived
in charge of Lieutenant W. D. Pollock.
The company arrived at 3 o'clock this
morning and brought one of the Colt's
rapid-fire guns like the one now in the
armory of the Wilmington Light Infantry.
These companies and the ones from
Maxton and Clinton were stationed on
guard at different times last night in
various parts of the country.

Payment for Philippines.

New York, Nov. 10.—A Washington
dispatch to the Herald says: Instead of
paying Spain \$40,000,000 as an indemnity
for the cession of the Philippine Islands
to the United States, President
McKinley simply proposes to reimburse
her for the debt of \$1,000,000 contracted
for public improvements. The President
and his cabinet have carefully noted
that the sentiment expressed through-
out the country during the past week
has been in opposition to the suggestion
to indemnify Spain to the extent first
proposed.

As first given out by the administra-
tion, it was intended to assume the entire
Philippine debt, which amounts to
\$40,000,000. The present intention of
the President is to pay the debt contracted
by Spain for the establishment of
lighthouses, harbor improvements and
public buildings. All told, it is stated,
this does not amount to a very large
sum, being fixed at about \$1,000,000.
Friends of Spain in the diplomatic corps
say it is an outrage for the President to
offer such a small sum.

caused a sensation today by calling upon
Chauncey M. Depew in Mr. Depew's office
and having a long talk with him. Mr.
Depew went to see Senator Platt in the
Fifth Avenue Hotel this evening and re-
mained with him for two hours. Chair-
man Odell, of the republican State com-
mittee, was called into the conference.
Mr. Croker admitted it right that he had
been to call upon Mr. Depew, but only
to obtain information about a train.

In spite of these explanations, some
of the democratic leaders jumped to the
conclusion that Mr. Croker had promised
Mr. Depew Tammany support for the
United States senatorship.

Wilmington the Centre of News
Interest.

Atwater's Seat Will Not be Con-
tested. Annual Meetings of
Railroads. Russell Will
Not Talk About
Wilmington.

JOURNAL BUREAU.

Raleigh, N. C., November 11.—
Of course interest centered all yester-
day in the state affairs at Wilmington.
State troops are there it is true, but
where may they not be needed next with
negroes at fever heat all through the
past. It is surely to be regretted that
the Democrats, so long as they had things
surely in their hands did not more peace-
ably direct things there. No matter what
was the cause of the trouble, it will al-
ways be held against the Democrats
that they began their rule with the death
of eleven negroes.

The count today gives the Democrats
only 7 Congressmen. It was thought
that Lantry in the 8th District was de-
feated, but he was re-elected, (Republi-
can) in that district, and White, (negro)
in the 2nd district. Atwater, the Inde-
pendent Populist candidate from this
district, who was supported by the Demo-
crats, says he will vote with the Demo-
crats, that there is nothing else for him
to do. It was reported that Jenkins, the
fusion candidate would contest Atwater's
seat but he says now he has no grounds
for contest.

The annual meeting of the Raleigh
and Gaston R. R. stockholders was held
yesterday. President Hoffman and the
old board of directors were re-elected.
The other roads under the Seaboard Air
Line system also had a stockholders
meeting, (The Raleigh and Augusta Air
Line and the Durham and Northern) and
re-elected all old officers.

At the annual Chrysanthemum show
which is being held here John H. Small
& Sons, Florists of Washington City
have most generously made a magnifi-
cent donation of an exhibit of 24 varieties,
the most superb flowers ever seen
here. This gift of Mr. Small is greatly
appreciated by the ladies especially when
it is known that he entered his exhibit
for no prize.

Governor Russell declines to ex-
press himself on the Wilmington mat-
ter.

J. B. Fontane, Republican clerk of
the United States District court today
says "this election has settled two
things in North Carolina, the negro
as a politician and the Populist
party."

Railroad Commissioners Caldwell
and Pearson were here today as witness

want to put on the tax books \$1,000,000
of bonds held by Raleigh and Gaston
road. The holding of these bonds of
another road in return for a loan came
out in a suit before the Railroad Com-
mission.

A SMALL MARGIN.

Control of the House by the Republi-
cans. Talk of the Commission.

WASHINGTON, November 11.—The re-
sult of the elections overshadowed every-
thing else, this week, in Washington,
although the peace commission, at Paris,
held an important joint session. No
class of politicians are entirely satisfied
with the elections, although all of them
manage to find something to rejoice
over. And there are others besides the
politicians who would have preferred
that the House should not have been so
close. An election as that was invari-
ably leads to bickering and charges and
countercharges, which engender bad
feelings, and results in injuring the
country abroad, if not at home. Accord-
ing to the best information obtainable
at Washington, the Republicans will
control the House, but it will be by a
very small margin, and will not be con-
ceded by their opponents until the official
count in a number of close districts
has been made.

There are rumors floating around
alleging that sensational testimony,
which was purposely withheld until
after the election, will shortly be given
before the War Investigating Commis-
sion, and that it is likely to be followed
by the disgrace of some officers. It is
the easiest thing in the world to start a
sensational rumor in Washington, and
as a rule they attract little attention, but
this one has been reiterated so persist-
ently since the election that it appears
to be finding believers. A short time
will determine its truth or falsity, as the
commission will not take much more
testimony.

The Spanish Leaving.

SANTIAGO, Cuba, November 10.—From
the captain of the Havana ship Heriera,
which arrived today from the north
east, it is learned that the Spaniards
are evacuating the Holguin district rapidly.
Four thousand men on board two ves-
sels left last week. Three more vessels
will take the balance.
