EXPANSION.

Philippines and Other Territory Ceded to the United States.

Paris, Nov. 28.—Spain has accepted the United States' offer of \$20,000,000, and a joint session of the peace commissioners this afternoon consented without condition to relinquish Cuba and to cede Porto Rico, Guam and the Philippine Islands, including the Sulu group.

A Paris dispatch says it is understood that the United States will also purchase the Island of Ulau in the Caroline group, although this will not be demanded as in the case of the Philippines.

The terms of peace exacted and obtained by victorious America from conquered Spain are now practically complete. These are:

Abandonment of sovereignty over Cuba.

Cession of Porto Rico and all the other islands known as the Spanish West Indies.

Cession of the Island of Guam, in the Ladroneas.

Cession of the Philippine Islands, including the Sulu group.

The United States refuses to assume any of the colonial debts of Spain.

The Sulu Islands, which the United States is to acquire, are in the Indian ocean, between the Mindoro or Sulu sea on the north, the Celebes sea on the south and that of Mindanao on the northeast. Their length is about 200 miles.

The archipelago consists of nearly 150 islands, most of them small, and divided into groups, named after the three principal islands.

The New England Fair.

Boston, November 28.—It may be that fully a hundred lives have been lost in this vicinity in the terrible gale and blizzard of Saturday and Sunday. At least twenty-five sailors are known to have perished on smaller craft, wrecked in Boston harbor, and tonight there are grave doubts as to the safety of the summer P. island, which sailed from here Saturday night for Portland, Maine, with 65 passengers and a crew of 15 men.

About thirty-five vessels of all sizes and classes are either sunk or adrift in and near Boston harbor as a result of the blizzard. Seven large schooners and two Baltimore coal barges are completely wrecked. Not until daylight did the awful havoc become apparent. Not since 1832 has a storm caused such destruction of property and the loss of life so near this city.

Trains in the Snow

New York, Nov. 28.—Planes in Eastern Long Island which have been cut off from railroad communication with this city since Saturday's storm are still without train service. The tracks will not be cleared until tomorrow.

Towns in Suffolk county, east of Babylon, have had no train service since Friday evening. The Montauk line of the Long Island Railroad is open to Babylon but from Babylon, to Greenport, a distance of fifty miles, no train is running.

The railroad cuts in the Shinnecock hills are reported to have ten feet of snow in them.

THE STATE CAPITAL.

Suggestion That Next Legislature Finish Early

Advantage of Saying this Time. Presentation of Hawaiian Report to State. Small Number of Imates at Soldiers Home.

JOURNAL BUREAU, Raleigh, N. C., November 29.

The Secretary of State received a few days ago 17 volumes of the laws and reports of Hawaii. These date back as far as 1846.

The suggestion which is being made that the legislature push its work ahead, and finish up about 10 days before the allotted 60 days are ended seems to be a good one. The reason for doing this is that the legislature can take a recess from the time it finishes its work until 1900, and then can meet again if necessary without being called by the Governor in extra session.

It is also suggested that while the legislature is looking to impeaching the Governor that it might as well look into the fact that Secretary of State Thompson is guilty of malicious libel.

There are now only 53 inmates at the Soldiers' Home. This is the smallest number that has been there for some time.

Jim Booker, the negro who is to be hung here in January for murder has made a second attempt to break jail. He was not successful, and will be more closely watched.

Warrants have been drawn on the State Treasury for \$33,177.84 for mobilizing the State troops. The State paid this, and the government is to refund it.

A board to assess the value of property of the State Guard used by the volunteers, met today. The board was composed of B. S. Royster, S. S. Batche or and H. P. Brown.

Governor Russell expects to visit the 1st Regiment in camp at Savannah and be present at the review of General Lee's Corps on December 15th.

There are some 330 cases on the docket for the United States District court which meets here next Tuesday, December 6th.

Can Hold Colonies.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 28.—Senator Morgan, of Alabama, the ranking Democratic member of the Foreign Relations Committee, strongly endorses the doctrine, opposed by so many public men, that the United States can hold the Philippines as a colony, imposing tariff duties against its citizens and excluding them from the franchise. The Senator said tonight:

"The constitution does not enter into the question at all. That paper was designed to control matters between the States and Territories of the Union, and did not concern itself about outside matters. Our government can have as much right to hold colonies as France or England, and to make such rules for their control as they may see fit."

Japan Against Russia.

VICTORIA, B. C., Nov. 28.—The steamer Glenogle, which has arrived here, brings news from Tien-Tsin that Japan has decided to resist Russian aggression. She is preparing to attempt to drive the Czar's troops from Corea, and to this end large detachments of troops are being landed.

A large number of Japanese spies have been captured by the Russians at Port Arthur and shot. Seven Japanese, all officers of the Imperial Japanese army, were taken and on their persons were found drawings of the principal fortifications. A day after their capture they were summarily shot.

The Japanese government has ordered another new battle ship from Vickers, Sons & Maxim, of Barrow-in-Furness, England, for \$4,000,000. It will be over 15,000 tons displacement.

DON'T LIE US.

All Europe Dislikes the Peace Settlement. England Alone Approves.

PARIS, November 28.—There is no denying that the whole European continent will bitterly resent American acquisition of the Philippines. This sentiment is not confined to diplomats, but especially here in Paris it is the opinion constantly heard in the highest French society. A high official of the French foreign office said yesterday:

"The appearance of the Americans in eastern waters is a disturbing factor to the whole of Europe. Americans, as is well known, lack diplomatic manners, and will surely bring constant trouble to all of us."

As to the general sentiment, Mr. William T. Stead, who has just returned here from a tour of France, Belgium, Germany, Russia, Austria, Turkey and Italy, and who has seen the highest politicians in each country, and in some cases the rulers, said in an interview:

"Outside of England, I have not met a single non-American who was not opposed to the expansion of America. Nor through my whole tour of Europe have I met a European who did not receive the protestations of the genuine sincerity with which the American people entered on the war with more or less mocking incredulity."

Mr. Stead says that the bitterest hostility of all was found at the Vatican.
