Fifthe-A pledge of the United States to preserve order in the Philippines pending the ratification of the treaty. Sixth-The mutual release of military

Seventh-The cession by Spain of the the Carolines.

Eighth-The mutual relinquishment of ndemnity claims. Ninth-The religious freedom of the

Carolines, assuring the rights of Amerioun missionaries there. Tenth-Cable landing rights at place rithin the Spanish jurisdiction.

Eleventh-The release by Spain of po itical prisoners, who are being punished for offenses in Cubs and the Philippines Twelfth-The pledge of the United States to inaugurate in the Philippines an "open door" policy and to guarantee such a policy to Spain for at least twelve

Thirteenth-A revival of the treatie roken by the war.

The first six articles were mutually greed upon. The terms of evacuation of the Philippines will be practically the same as those for the evacuation of Cuba and Porto Rico. As to the mutuel release of milliary prisoners Spain will libtrate her rebel prisoners and the United States will liberate the Manila garrison and the Spaniards held by Aguinaldo
