RALEIGH, N. C., Dec. 7 .- State Labo Commissioner Hamrick says: "North the South and exceeds all the Southern States in the value and number of manufseturing establishments This great ovement toward becoming a manufacturing community deserves especial enouragement, for with our climates, water power and other facilities for rofitable manufacturing, there is no reason why this should not become the greatest manufacturing State of the Union.
