RALEIGH.

Judge Battle Holds His First Court.
Judge Parnell's Charge. Game is Pleasural. A Strange Bombie Marriage.

RALEIGH, December 8.—It is publicly announced that James E. Boyd is in charge of the matter of prosecuting the Wilmington people for driving out United States Commissioner Bunting.

Work is to begin by the end of the year on the highway end of the Richmond, Petersburg and Carolina Railway. Twenty-two miles of the other end are complete, and rolling stock is to be secured immediately.

Judge Dorsey Battle, of the Eastern Criminal Circuit Court, is holding his first court in Halifax this week. His first case is in the case of the State vs. the Democrats particular pleasure.

The agricultural department begins the new fiscal year with the neat balance of \$23,000.

The State is now paying the expenses of having the military on duty at Wilmington, under Governor Russell's orders, the total being only \$1,800.

In his charge to the grand jury here in the United States District Court, Judge Parnell did not refer to the Wilmington matter, but charged against interference with United States officers. He says this is what he has always charged. He did not touch on any violation of the elective franchise, as he had before him no complaint as to that.

The State has chartered the Winston Furniture Company, capital \$10,000.

The attorney-general was asked by the secretary of State to settle the question as to the issue of the certificate of election to George H. Brown, Jr., as Superior Court judge of the first district. Brown was voted for also as George H. Brown. The attorney-general tells the secretary of State to treat the names as designating the same person, and issue the certificate accordingly. So the certificate was issued and Judge Brown duly commissioned by the Governor.

Attorney-General Griggs is hunting partridges in Guilford county. James E. Boyd is with him. Birds are very plentiful. A farmer here says there are 100 coveys on his plantation.

News reaches here of a double wedding at Rockingham. W. W. Hayward, aged sixty-eight, formerly editor of the Tribune here, and a commercial traveler named Pitts, from Virginia, married the Misses Steele, twins, only sixteen years old.

Mr. H. C. McNair, of Maxton, and Mr. Neville, of Charlotte, two fine checker players, will play a series of games in Winston on the 15th instant, for the State championship.

At Winston-Salem there is held a health conference of the state board of health with the people. These conferences are held annually at some point in the State. They are for the mutual discussion of all questions included in the word sanitation.

CONTESTS FOR SEATS.

Not Likely That the Democratic Congressman Will Suffer.

Lisney Claims to Know of No Movement Towards Investigation.
The Nash and Davidson Monuments. Pearson Will Not Talk.

WASHINGTON, December 7.—In Republican circles it is said that Representative Lisney (Republican), of North Carolina, who was re-elected to the Fifty-sixth Congress, will in all probability be made chairman of one of the Elections Committees. His committee would without doubt be given any contests coming from his State and would thus be placed in the attitude now assumed by General Walker, of the Ninth Virginia.

There is no room for doubt that the troubles which existed in North Carolina at the time of the election will be used as an argument in favor of the contestants, no matter how little realistic there may be in the claim in any particular case. But it is by no means a foregone conclusion that a majority of the members will be willing to seat the contestants. It is beginning to be realized by the leaders that by unseating congressmen the ranks of the enemy are solidified for some time to come.

Representative Lisney was asked if there was any likelihood of an attempt being made to have Congress investigate the race troubles in North Carolina. He said he had no knowledge of any definite plans, although there had been considerable discussion among some of the members as to how an investigation could be brought about.

Mr. Lisney has several bills which he hopes to have considered at this session. One affects the internal revenue and another the civil service. Another provides for a public building at Winston, N. C.

At the last session Senator Butler succeeded in getting through the Senate a joint resolution to carry into effect two resolutions of the Continental Congress, directing monuments to be erected to the memory of Generals Francis Nash and William Lee Davidson, of North Carolina.

Representative Kitchin followed up the bill in the House, and a favorable report was made by Mr. Cummings, from the House Committee on the Library. Mr. Kitchin has enlisted the services of Mr. Lisney, and together they hope that the tardy honor to the memory of the Revolutionary heroes may not be much longer deferred.

Representative Richmond Pearson declines to say a word with reference to his contest in the Fifty-sixth Congress, even refusing to say whether he will make the contest at all, but his attorneys are going right ahead with the taking of depositions.

We have three inmates in our county jail, two whites and one colored.

The cold weather here has caused most of our wood piles to grow very small by degrees and some of them much less.

Seed cotton is coming to market in smaller quantities and is selling for \$1.90 per cwt. Corn, but little in market, is selling at 50 cents per bushel. Market well supplied with fish and oysters at fair prices.

Mrs. Howerton of New Berne who has been visiting relatives in Jones county returned home this morning.

The annual fruit tree agents are here distributing trees among the farmers.

The Sheriff, Clerk of the Superior Court and Register of Deeds presented their several bonds to the Commissioners and were all accepted.

During the last two weeks there has been sold here over 450 bales of cotton ranging from 4.80 to 5.25 per cwt. On one day during the interval there were sold here 241 bales.

Fresh pork is coming in our market in small quantities, selling at 44@5 cts per lb. The market is completely exhausted in chickens and eggs.

Died at her home in Cypress creek township, Mrs. Annie E. Hammond, widow of Dr. A. F. Hammond of Jones county, on the 21st of November last. Mrs. Hammond had an attack of paralysis which caused her death. She was a constant member of the Methodist church for many years. This estimable lady was about 55 years old and leaves several daughters and sons nearly all grown, besides she has many relatives and friends to mourn their loss.
