One of the regiments is the now no torious Sixth Virginia, which has been so constantly before the public. It will be remembered that this regiment was so unmanageable soon after they left Virginia as to provoke the resignation of their white officers, which resignstions have not yet been accepted.

These troops have been a constant source of annovance wherever they have been stationed, several of their number having been killed in drunken

The whole Virginia regiment was at one time under arrest and were courtmartialed for unsoldierly conduct and given a sentence that was considered by distinguished parties as inadequate for their offence.
