Mrs Kate Richardson of this city received a telegram Sunday morning from Greensboro, N. C. Conveying the sad intelligence of the death of her brother, the Rev. Jesse A. Cuninggim, which occurred Saturday night.

He had been ill for some time, but the immediate cause of his death was heart fallure.

Rev. Mr. Cuninggim, was one of the oldest members of the North Carolina Conference, M. E. Church, South. After long and successful service in the pastoral relation he was called to the respon sible work of presiding elder. In that capacity he served the Raleigh district 4 years, and with the close of the last conference year completed his time limit on the Durham district. Admonished by failing health and the infirmities of age, he realized that his work in the ministry was finished.
