Green, one of the largest lumber dealers in North Carolina, said today that all grades of timber in his State are bringing from \$3 to \$3 a thousand more than at this time last year. These prices, it is thought, will hold for the entire season, as the mills have very little on hand, and will need at least 35,000,000 to 40,000,000 feet during the year. From the outlook there is not more than half that smount in sight, as the season is so far advanced that lumber men will not have time to cut much before the crop season will be
