## THE STATE FARMS.

Northampton in Fine Condition,  
Caledonian Behind.

One Manager Works Without Pay.  
N. C. Medical Association. Manila Cannon Gets a Settled Place. Smallpox.

Raleigh, May 16.—Penitentiary Superintendent Day has returned from a visit of inspection to the penitentiary farms on the Roanoke river. He says the "Northampton" farm is like a garden while both the "Caledonian" farms are very much behind. The reason is the carelessness of the fusion supervisors, who have now been removed. The "Tillery" farm is in fine condition. Mr. Richard Tillery, the general manager of the farms, is the one official who serves the State without pay. He is wealthy and does not want any pay for what he does.

Crops look extremely well, though late and the crop report to be issued today will be quite favorable. Local hailstorms have done some damage.

The term of the United States District Court here, which begins next week, will continue a fortnight. Three postmasters are to be tried for stealing.

The State board of internal improvements is called to meet this week to elect trustees of the Atlantic and North Carolina Railway.

The semi-centennial meeting of the North Carolina Medical Association will be held at Asheville, May 26-June 2.

Only one case of smallpox now remains in the city limits of Raleigh. The patient is a railway employe named Williams. There is now a separate pest-house for whites, but for some reason the has not been sent to it, but is at home.

The trophy cannon from Manila, the gift of the cruiser Raleigh, to Raleigh, is now installed in the State museum. It stands on a platform, surrounded by an ornamental bronze railing.

The contract for the large annex to the museum will be awarded June 15th. There are six bidders.

A number of persons were discharged from the pest house, and some from the detention camp. Vaccination is now nearly complete. Only one arrest has been made, and in this case the man, a religious enthusiast submitted, after sentenced to work on the road.

The decision of the Supreme court that the Fusionists are to hold the road does not prevent the board from electing additional trustees. The Fusionists can only hold the road until September 1st. The Democrats take complete control of the Agricultural Department June 15. They will make many removals.

## MONEY STAYS HERE.

None Of Spain's Indemnity Goes Away From This Country.

New York, May 15.—The fourth and last of the \$5,000,000 treasury warrants paid to Spain for the Philippine Islands was presented at the National City Bank today by a representative of the French embassy. This draft will pass through the clearing house in tomorrow's exchanges. Not one dollar of the \$15,000,000 already paid to Spain has really gone out of this country, the entire transaction having been conducted on the basis of foreign exchange and as there has been a large trade balance in favor of this country in about every one of the continental money markets, the indemnity money has been charged against these balances.

## AGUINALDO RETREATS.

Filipino Leader Said To Have Fled Into A Northern Province Of Luzon.

SAN MIGUEL, May 14 (via Manila, May 15).—Gen. Gregorio del Pilar believes he has been deserted by the Filipino government and desires to surrender if he can secure what he regards as honorable terms from the Americans.

It is now said that Aguinaldo has fled into the province of Nueva Ecija. On April 29 he retreated by carriage from Baling through San Isidro, and nothing has been heard from him in the two weeks since.

The five thousand Spanish prisoners who are reported to be held by the Filipinos have been carried into a northern province and scattered among small garrisons. They are beyond American reach this season unless a Filipino surrender takes place within three weeks.

The Filipino hospital near San Isidro is reported to be overwhelmed with wounded. General Pilar's main subsistence depot is five miles in front of Lawton.

The indignation of the natives has compelled their generals to countermand the orders to burn the towns as they retreated. The American policy of not destroying property is creating a revulsion of feeling in favor of the invaders.

Five American prisoners were carried through this town last week. Their names are unknown. Natives are returning through the American lines to their own homes.

## HOME FOR DEWEY.

WASHINGTON, May 15.—F. A. Vanderbilt, Assistant Secretary of the Treasury; Charles H. Allen, Assistant Secretary of the Navy; Perry S. Heath, Assistant Postmaster General; Brigadier General Corbin and Ellis H. Roberts, Treasurer of the United States, who have been appointed a national committee to take charge of the funds with which to purchase a home for Admiral Dewey in Washington, had a meeting today in Mr. Vanderbilt's office.

The committee will be glad to serve any newspaper, organization or individual willing to make a contribution to the purpose in view. The national character of the committee makes it the proper one to have charge of the matter, and it is expected that the many newspapers who propose taking up the work will co-operate with this committee.

Treasurer Roberts is now prepared to receive contributions in any amount. A handsomely designed receipt will be gotten out immediately by the engravers at the Bureau of Engraving and Printing and all the contributors will receive such a receipt. A formal address to the public will be issued soon.

The first subscription to the fund, \$250, was received today from General Felix Angus of the Baltimore American, and he will receive receipt No. 1.
