## RUSSELL AT IT.

### He is Taking An Active Part In Political Matters.

#### But Will Have A Hard Road To Travel. Recruiting, Killing At Rockingham. Normans Near. Hot Weather All Around.

RALEIGH, Aug. 7.—The railways will at the hearing of their cases before Judge Stimson, at Asheville, September 13, have a large array of counsel. These are the cases in which the Atlantic Coast Line, The Seaboard Air Line and the Southern are seeking to prevent the Corporation Commission from adding \$10,000,000 to their assessment.

There is a hitch between the Commission and Governor Russell as to the counsel to be employed on the State's side. The Governor claims that he has the sole right to employ counsel, and that he alone can pay them. Of course the Commissioners, all Democrats, distrust the Governor, and will employ their own counsel, well knowing that the Legislature will pay the bill. The Governor has had a number of such contentions as this on State matters, and in every case has gone to the wall.

It is said that Governor Russell has named Miss Darby as postmistress of Wilmington. The Republicans tell quite a long story about why Chadbourne was removed; that it was because, in order to have the office rated higher, he had induced the banks etc., to buy very large quantities of stamps and that in some cases these were returned after the office had been re-rated. In fact, one Republican went so far as to say that one bank had thus returned \$600 in stamps.

The Republicans admit that Governor Russell was conferred with as to this appointment; that this courtesy was shown him by Senator Pritchard because he appointed the latter's father-in-law, Bowman, Judge. They seek, however, to put it on the ground that the courtesy was shown the Governor "because Wilmington is his home town." But this is entirely too thin. The Republicans are not in the habit of showing the Governor any courtesies.

J. S. E. Young, who has been made a lieutenant in one of the new volunteer regiments raised by General Oatis in the Pullpines, is from Henderson, and is a son of Major Young, of that place. He was sergeant major of one of the volunteer regiments.

Recruiting for the Twenty-seventh is stopped, as the regiment is full. Lieutenant Settle will now enlist men for the Thirty-third Regiment, at Fort Sam Houston, Texas; the Thirty-fourth at Fort Logan, Col., and the Thirty-fifth, at Vancouver Barracks, Wash. The total number of North Carolinians in the Twenty-seventh Regiment is 60.

The State Treasurer reports that during the eight months ended July 31 the receipts were \$1,337,968 and the disbursements \$1,186,132. Included in the receipts are \$190,904 from the sale of peon- tary debt bonds. Of the latter fund \$35,144 has been so far expended.

September 4 the people of Salisbury will vote on the issue of \$100,000 of public improvement bonds.

During July here the mean temperature was 75, which is the average for the past 13 years. The rainfall was 8.35 inches, the average for the month during the past 13 years being 6.67 inches. The excess in rainfall and snowfall this year so far is 7.33 inches. There were no less than eleven days in July on which there were thunderstorms.

The withering weather has made life rather a burden for people who mind the weather. The temperature went very near the 100 degree mark.

State Chemist Kilgore has returned from the farmers' institute at Red Springs, and says it was the best and the most largely attended of all ever held in the State.

Four of North Carolina's public officials weigh 1,100 pounds. Governor Russell leads. His weight is given as 345. The commissioner of immigration, John W. Thompson, weighs 275. J. U. L. Harris 263, and T. K. Bruner 245.

In Rockingham Saturday A. O. Flynn, a merchant, shot his brother in the breast. Death was speedy. There was a sort of feud between the brothers. Flynn is in jail. He contends that the killing was accidental. The jury of inquest said it was murder, premeditated and cold blooded.

The Perry sisters, the exponents of the "Hollies" or "Fire Trial Sanctification" doctrine in the Piedmont section, are now at work at Marion. These women have a school where they teach their doctrine, and they have disciples. At least 500 Mormon missionaries or proselyters are now at work in this State. Some communities are being boycotted.

The Agricultural and Mechanical College silico grounds are being graded and put in very fine condition. It is said to be more than probable that one of the best teams of the National League will come here next spring and practice on these grounds.

Charles M. Clark, of Mocksville, has been appointed horticulturist at the insane asylum here. The salary is \$200. He graduated at the Agricultural and Mechanical College here.

### Don't Want War.

PANAMA, Aug. 6.—The Volkraad will tomorrow discuss in secret session the proposal of Joseph Chamberlain, British Secretary of State for the Colonies. Mr. Chamberlain suggested that the effect and exact meaning of the new franchise law be inquired into by a joint commission.

President Kruger has also notified the British High Commissioner in South Africa, Sir Alfred Milner, Governor of Orange Colony, of the willingness of the Government of the South African Republic to accept any friendly suggestion likely to lead to a settlement.

It is evident, judging from the reports arriving from different parts of the Transvaal, that the burghers do not desire trouble with Great Britain, and on this account the situation wears a more promising aspect.

### Dewey at Naples.

NAPLES, August 5.—The United States cruiser Olympia, with Admiral Dewey on board, has arrived here. As the cruiser entered the port salutes were exchanged.

Admiral Dewey and the crew of the Olympia are all in good health. It is said the cruiser will remain here eight or ten days.
