THE STATE CAPITAL.

Done for Law School. Located by Dispensary, Castle Grounds.

RALEIGH, August 16.—It was noted a few days ago that an officer of the Third Regiment had been arrested in N. City. A letter from there states that not only the captain of the company, but several of the men, are under arrest, and Acting Mayor Patterson telegraphed that he holds the company's equipments and wants to know what to do with them. The Adjutant General has telegraphed to find out what the trouble is.

The board of trustees of the State University is called to meet here on the 19th to elect a dean of the law school to succeed Judge Shepherd, who has resigned. Judge James C. Macris, of Raleigh, is prominently mentioned in connection with the place.

Both the State Library and the library of the Agricultural and Mechanical College will be catalogued by the card system, so that it will be easier for visitors to get at the books.

A special from Greensboro says the clerk and negro waiter resigned their positions and locked the doors of the dispensary. They do not like the new manager, Mr. J. C. Bennett, who represented Guilford in the last General Assembly.

Dr. Cooper Carleton, the State veterinarian, after studying cattle fever, recommends to the Federal and State authorities for better control and suppression of the fever, a strict quarantine and better defined quarantine lines and the prohibiting of driving of cattle from infected free range counties to uninfected stock law counties.

The trustees of the State Library have sold recently \$80 worth of Colonial Records.

Raleigh's new gas company will issue \$50,000 in bonds and use the proceeds in equipping the big new plant.

Governor Russell has decided to accept the fact that the corporation commission had employed good counsel in the railroad injunction cases, so he ratifies the appointments of Judge Connor, of Wilson, and Messrs. Simmons, Fox and Ward, and adds to the list Messrs. J. C. L. Harris and Chas. A. Cook. The State pays lawyers' fees.

ALL AGAINST GOEBEL.

Kentucky's Bolting Democrats Will Meet To Name Fall State Ticket.

LEXINGTON, KY., Aug. 15.—Everything is in readiness for the anti-Goebel Democratic State Convention, which is to be called to order tomorrow afternoon in the Chautauque Auditorium for the purpose of nominating a full Democratic State ticket in opposition to the Democratic State ticket nominated at Louisville in June.

A telegram from Major P. P. Johnson who was until June chairman of the Democratic State Central Committee, says he will be present to call the convention to order if his health permits.

Delegates began arriving today, and this afternoon Captain James B. Clay, who has charge of the work of organizing the new movement, called about 40 of them together in conference. After a two hours exchange of views in private they adjourned, and the statement was given out by Captain Clay that the conference had agreed on placing a full ticket in the field.

It has been suggested by many anti-Goebel Democrats that only candidates for Governor and Lieutenant-Governor be named, as Goebel and his candidates for Lieutenant-Governor, W. H. Beckham were the only ones whom the opposition cared to defeat. But in the conference this afternoon it was agreed that "the entire Goebel ticket is permeated with Goebellism" and that the men composing it should go down in defeat.

Colonel Turner, of Montgomery county, offered a suggestion that may be adopted. He said in the conference that after the convention nominated its tickets the intended to make a motion to withdraw the entire ticket if Goebel and his fellow candidates would withdraw, and then hold a third State convention to nominate a new ticket, so that all Democrats might join in supporting it, and the Republican ticket be defeated. He admits he does not believe Goebel or any of his candidates will accept the challenge.

Although the conference lasted long there was no mention of a possible state and the convention will enter upon its work with less hesitating than any previous convention held in this State. No man seems to want a nomination, the only desire seeming to be to defeat Goebel.

It was expected that ex-Governor John Young Brown, who is to be the nominee of tomorrow's convention for Governor, would be here and take part in the conference this afternoon, but he sent this telegram to Captain Clay: "Impossible for me to attend conference this afternoon. There must be a full ticket."

It was stated here tonight that the fainting of Goebel at Mayfield Saturday is part of a plan whereby Goebel is making ready to withdraw from the race on the plea that he is not physically able to make the brushing campaign necessary to win. The statement is probably untrue, however.

To Be Issued By State For Purchase Penitentiary Farms.

RALEIGH, Aug. 16.—Treasurer Worth opened the bids today, for the \$50,000, North Carolina ten year 4 per cent, coupon bonds, to be used for the purchase of penitentiary farms.

The Wachovia, Loan and Trust Company, of Winston, N. C., was the highest bidder, at \$1,067 1/2, which would make the bonds realize \$65,950.

This same company was the purchaser of the \$110,000, issue of penitentiary bonds.
