While standing in the wings a waiting her first cue she was selzed with an attack of stage fright and trembled violently.

She went through her part mechanically and without apparent consciousness of her actions, but she played the scene better than she had done at rehearsal. one at rehearsal.
"At the close of her scene she came

off the stage, staggered to her dressing som and sank unconscious to the loor. She never recovered from her coma, and an autopsy-developed the fact that she had died of heart disease, though I had examined her shortly before and could find no trace of cardiac affection.


