All along the Free State allway from Springfontoin to Bloem-outein at every station Boers are comng to surrender Mausers, Martinis and piatols. Before the police headquarters here there is a long line of burghers, who are giving up their arms; 500 have aiready done so. Throughout the country 2,500 tilles and other fireams were handed in today. Eight hundred men have luid down their arms on the Basutoland

The whole southern half of the State shows a determination to end the struggle. It seems certain that if a British official can reach the northern lasgers

CAPE Town, March 18 .- The Mafeking relief column, Colonels Drummond and Peakman commanding, had a sharp ingagement at Fourteen Streams. The ritish succeeded in driving the Boers off. They had only a few losses.

PRETORIA, via Lorenzo Marquez, March 16.—The military situation is quiet. Generals Joubert and Boths have arrived at Kroonstadt, where they are consulting Presidents Kruger and Steyr as to the new defensive measures.


