## WAR ON CHINA.

### The Foreign Fleets Bombard and Capture the Chinese Forts.

American Vessels Join in the Attack. Russia Demands Indemnity. Many Missions at Risk. Legations at Peking Destroyed.

**LONDON, June 18.**—The Chinese forts at Taku fired on the allied fleets and the forts were taken by the foreigners.

The fleet when fired upon bombarded the forts and took possession. The engagement was a brief one. The American vessels participated in the fight and landed men in the attack.

A Japanese torpedo boat has arrived at Chefoo with the news of the taking of all the foreign legations at Peking.

Russia demands from China an indemnity of thirty million dollars for damage done to railways in which Russia is interested.

Japan sends twenty five hundred soldiers to Tsin Tsin. England sends a regiment from India to protect property in China. Twenty Roman Catholic missionaries and eight Sisters of Charity are missing.

MANILA, June 18.—The Ninth United States Infantry, which is now in the Philippines, has been ordered to Manila whence it will proceed to China.

The gunboat Concord, with marines on board, has sailed under sealed orders supposedly for China.

The British cruiser Buenaventura has sailed for Hongkong and Tientsin.

**LONDON, June 17.**—A dispatch to a London newspaper from Hongkong says that the Peking legations have been destroyed and that the German Minister, Baron von Kettler, has been murdered.

This is unconfirmed by the latest news. The French Consul at Tientsin cables that the European detachments sent to Peking are advancing slowly. In the report of rioting in Peking, the Consul reports, the Boxers burned the Protestant Episcopal establishments in the Chinese town. All is quiet in the French concession.

French troops, with artillery, are being sent from Tonquin to Tientsin, where they will arrive June 25. Others dispatched from France will arrive July 3. The minister of Marine has ordered a division of cruisers to be gotten ready for sea to reinforce the French squadrons in Chinese waters. Transportation is also being prepared to take military reinforcements.

### ROOSEVELT FOR VICE-PRES.

#### He Will Accept Under Certain Conditions. A Nomination Assured.

**PHILADELPHIA, June 18.**—The stamped for Theodore Roosevelt for Vice President on the Republican ticket with McKinley has set in. The contest for the position seems to be over.

Roosevelt consents if the nomination is demanded by other than Platt's delegation from New York. Senator Thurston says authoritatively that Roosevelt will accept. Platt gives notice that New York will support Roosevelt.

## RALEIGH.

### Republican Attempt to Misrepresent C. B. Aycock's Speech.

Heavy Rains Were General. Commencement at the State Normal. Extension of Seaboard Line. Editors and Teachers Return.

**RALEIGH, June 18.**—The Tennessee press association 125 members, passed here yesterday, homeward-bound from Morehead City. The editors say they greatly enjoyed their seaside experience. It was, for most of them, the first view of salt water.

The session of the North Carolina Teachers Assembly which ended yesterday with the annual sermon by Bishop Bondthaler, is said to have been one of the most successful ever held. Prof. J. Allen Holt of Oak Ridge, the new president, is one of the most active men in the State in his profession.

Heavy rains have fallen during the past 24 hours. In this section they have done some damage to lowland crops. Rain was needed over a large area of the State. There was considerable hail yesterday afternoon in some sections.

Among the Republicans who left here yesterday to attend their party's national convention at Philadelphia were revenue collector Duncan, postmaster Bally and Dr. D. H. Abbott of the corporation commission.

The State charters the Goldsboro Navigation Company, which will operate steamers and barges on the Neuse River. Its authorized capital is \$50,000.

Several Raleigh people went to Greensboro to attend the commencement exercises of the State Normal and Industrial College, which began yesterday with the annual sermon by Rev. Dr. John S. Watkins, now of Spartanburg S. C. but who was for a number of years pastor of the First Presbyterian church here. Today was given up to the senior class, which had its exercises.

It is said that the Seaboard Air Line will extend its line of rail 100 miles south of Tampa to Boca Grande in order to be that much nearer the West Indies, and on deeper water.

Aycock's speech, by which they seek to make it appear that he said the Democratic party proposed to rule by fraud, while as a matter of fact he said it meant to rule by law.
