ul-General, has instructions that the troops which it was intended to land here shall proceed north. This will be doue August 16 unless the order is counermanded in the interval by the Foreign Office. The final decision of the latter is awaited. The principal British banks and shipping fims have telegraphed to Lord Salisbury that the Government's decision to send the troops north will bave a disastrous effect and urging the Government to reconsider the question. The foreign consuls are equally alive to the results of such action on the Chinese

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
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
