Duguid of his election as Port Physician to fill the vacancy occasioned by the resignation of Dr. J. F. Rhem, and asked him to take immediate charge of the case remaining at the pest house for the consideration of \$100 per month.

We made every effort to employ white physician, but as none would accept the offer, we, having no authority to increase it, and recognizing the necessity for immediate action, proceeded at once, under instructions from the Board to employ Dr. W. Dr Lassiter immediately took charge and gave the case his personal attention until the negro was discharged as well

employ physician as needed. Upon motion the following rule wa dopted for plumbers in reference to City Water and Sewer Works.

No plumber or other person shall make alterations in or additions to any water or sewer pipes or fixtures where no motor is used unless the owner or agent shows a permit thereof signed by and Lumber Co. proper officer of the water and sewer system, and then only to the extent stated therein.
