RALEIGH.

Freight Rates Discussed. Auditorium Site Decided. Harris May Get a Short Job. The Flower Show.

Special to Journal. RALEIGH, November 14.—The corporation commission met today and took up the matter of freight rates. There were present as representatives of the great systems of railway, J. M. Culf of the Southern, H M Emerson of the Atlantle Coast Line and H. W. B. Glover of the Scaboard Air Line. James Kyle of Wilmington appeared a complainant.


