RALEIGH.

Much Interest Over the Kilgo Endorsement by the Conference.

Insurance Company Must Answer. The Marshall Case. Raleigh and the Y. M. C. A. Baptist Missionary Society Meeting.

Raleigh, N. C. December 6.—Insurance commissioner Young has given notice to the Maryland Casualty Co., to show cause why its license to do business in this State should not be revoked, for violation of the State law in writing policies from the home office and using unlicensed agents in North Carolina.

Inquiry was made at the office of the United States district attorney today as to whether the case of A. J. Marshall, charged with counterfeiting at Wilmington, would be tried again at this term of the Federal Court. The district attorney is sick, but assistant Speers said he did not believe the case would be tried because of the absence of a witness, Theodore Darkley, a Greek. He gave it in his private opinion that Darkley has left this country and returned to Greece.

The State charters the Washington Knitting mill, at Washington, capital \$3,000, S. T. Nicholson principal stockholder.

Assistant labor commissioner Felson has gone to Cincinnati, to attend a meeting of labor unions.

Much interest was expressed here among Methodists regarding the action of the North Carolina Methodist Episcopal Conference at New Bern yesterday in unanimously endorsing president Kilgo and trustees Odell and Duke of Trinity College, this being regarded as an expression of disapproval of the action of Rev. T. J. Gattis in bringing suit for libel against Kilgo, Odell and Duke. It is said Gattis will at once transfer to the Western North Carolina Conference, which it is asserted is in sympathy with him.

The great need for an auditorium here is again shown at the present session of the Baptist State convention, a large body. If there were an auditorium the inauguration of Gov. Aycock and the other State officers could be held in it to great advantage.

A. G. Krebel, general secretary of the Y. M. C. A., is here, seeing if it is possible to revive it here. For three years Raleigh has had no Association. The methods then in vogue were miserable and the Association collapsed. At Charlotte there are 650 members, at Wilmington 485, at Winston 400 and at Asheville 450. In all these places business men manifest much interest in the Association and its work. Krebel is working among the business men here.

A charter is granted to the Welch Furniture Company at High Point, capital \$25,000. This will be the twenty-fourth wood working factory in that live town, which is the centre of the furniture industry in the South.

A meeting of the stock holders of the Raleigh and Gaston railway was called to be held here to-day, and Grover, Ryer's attorney was on hand, but, as usual there was no meeting.

The Baptist Woman's Missionary Society held its annual session here to-day, over 100 delegates attending, these representing more than 400 local societies. The session was held in the Presbyterian church. Mrs. D. Hish of Winston conducted the opening devotional exercises. Mrs. J. D. Boothall made the address of welcome. Mrs. Mary Hodgins of Marshall, responding. Miss Fannie Heck of Raleigh reported as president of the central committee, and Mrs. W. N. Jones her report as corresponding secretary. Then the general secretary of the Baptist boards made talks, there being Rev. Drs. Willingham, Kerfoot, Frost and White.

Tax Comes off Beer.

WASHINGTON, D. C., December 5.—An increase on the rebate allowed upon beer stamps from seven and one-half per cent. to twenty per cent. was decided upon by the Republican majority of the Ways and Means Committee. This means that the net tax upon beer will be reduced from \$1.85 per barrel to \$1.60 per barrel. The reduction of revenue caused by this change will be about \$9,000,000, and will raise the total reductions under the House bill to nearly \$40,000,000.
