### STATE REFORMATORY.

Attorney General Douglas Working For Its Establishment.

Pension Warrants Sent out Only Two Convicts Attempted to Escape From Penitentiary. New Tree Discovery. Increase in Valuation.

RALEIGH, December 13.—Today the pension warrants were sent out by the auditor to the clerks of the various counties and they will be ready for distribution by the registers of deeds on the 15th. They are as follows: 1st class \$58 a year, 111; 2nd class, \$43.50, 358; 3d class, \$29.04, 4th class, \$14.50, 2326; widows, who get 4th class, 2658. The amount covered by the warrants is \$112,239. This is not as large as last year by \$6000. This is because last year the pension account was overdrawn \$1800 in order to distribute the fund on hand. This year a balance of \$1700 is left. Last year the fund got \$5900, which the secretary of State had turned in as an old land grant fund. The legislature directed him to turn it over to the treasurer and after 6 months time the latter turned it into the pension fund.

The Winyah Sanitarium and Hotel Company was today authorized by the State to drop the word "hotel" in its charter. It is at Asheville.

It is said that the sales of leaf tobacco here this year will approximate a million pounds. This has been about the average for several years.

The examinations at the agricultural and mechanical college began today.

The warden of the penitentiary says only two convicts have attempted escape from the guards this year. One got away. The other was knocked down and caught. A number of the so-called "strutlers" have escaped.

Attorney General Douglas is sending to the attorney general of each State a request for information as to reformatories for young criminals. He is also in communication on the same subject with the secretaries of the great religious and benevolent societies in this State. He is devoted to the good work of securing the establishment of a reformatory. It now appears that this city will be the last taken.

Prof. Massey of the Agricultural and Mechanical College has discovered a tree which is unique in the United States. It is a golden-brown tree. The berries are a bright golden color. A tree is in this county. Two or three others are heard of elsewhere.

The increase in the valuation of real estate personal property in this State in 1929 over 1928 was \$1,290,949. In 1929 over 1928 was \$2,100,000, and this year to \$2,500,000 over 1929.

LONDON, Dec. 12.—The negotiations of the Powers in regard to the joint Chinese note were concluded satisfactorily yesterday, all agreeing to the conditions identically as outlined by Count Von Buelow, the Imperial Chancellor of Germany, November 19th with the exception of the introductory clause, saying the demands are irrevocable, which is eliminated.

Up to this date, in response to our letters we have received 2,285 replies of average date December 6th, which we consider as reliable as any information that can be obtained on this subject, and we tabulate as follows:


