LEGISLATURE CONVENES.

Lieut. Governor Reynolds Presiding Officer Senate.

Only One Senator Absent. Fusionists Refused to Vote For Senate Officers. Present to Ex-Speaker Conner. Two Contests in House.

Special to Journal. RALEIGH, January 9.—The Legislature convened at noon, all the Senators save Jones of 4th district present. He is sick, but will be here Monday.

Charles Daniels, clerk last session called the roll and Lieut. Gov. Reynolds administered the oath.

When Stringfield, of Suncombe was sworn in, notice was given of contest for his seat by Republicans.

Officers of the senate were elected, the fusionists not voting for them.

Speight introduced a resolution appropriating one thousand dollars for the better ventilation of the legislative halls.

First bill introduced was by Marshall, Republican, to repeal the present election law. It was tabled in one minute.

Vann introduced bills extending limits of town of Hertford and incorporating the Hertford banking company. Arrington a bill to establish graded schools at Rocky Mount.

All members of the house gave a present to H. G. Connor speaker of the last house over which he presided.

The Democrats gave Walter E. Moore 96 votes for speaker, the Republicans gave Ebbs of Madison sixteen votes.

Gov. Russell was notified of the organization of the Legislature. His message goes in tomorrow.

There are two contests in the house from Wilkes and Davidson counties. Committees were named to have charge of the inauguration ceremonies next Tuesday. A joint session is ordered for that day to canvass votes for state officers.

Lieutenant Governor Reynolds decides not to resign and will serve out his time which expires on Tuesday. It is said Republican members will vote for Richmond Pearson for United States Senator.

Navy Guns Back Up Our Consul.
TACOMA, Wash, Jan. 8.—The steamship Tacoma brings news from Hongkong that the American Consul at Canton has required the Viceroy of Kwangtung to suppress several seditious native newspapers which were being circulated throughout Canton, advising the natives to rise against foreigners.

He pointed to the coast defence vessel Monterey, lying in the harbor, as evidence that his wishes must be respected. The Viceroy then gave orders to suppress the papers.

Death Penalty For Kidnaping.
LAFAYETTE, Ind. Jan. 8.—A bill being drafted in this State against kidnaping will provide life imprisonment or death, at the discretion of the Court, for kidnaping any person under 21 years old, except in cases where parents absent their own children.

GRAND LODGE MASONS REPORT

Railroad Officials Considering Tax Case. Acquitted of Murder. Active Copper Mining.

RALEIGH, January 9.—The Grand Lodge of Masons this morning received the annual report of the Oxford Orphan asylum. It says the property has increased in value over \$30,000 in the past 8 years. B. N. Duke gave \$7,500 to the asylum, the Grand Lodge to give an equal amount, of the Grand Lodge's part \$3,750 yet remains to be paid. An electric light plant is greatly needed. The State sanitary engineer makes a gratifying report on the cleanliness of the institution. There is a shoe shop, farm, wood working shops, printing office, etc. There is also a private furniture factory in which a number of the boys work half the day. There are 8 teachers. The head of the pupils has been good; only one death during the year. The total of the slaying class brought in \$4,396. There are 218 pupils.

The officials of the three great systems of railroads in this State were in conference today at Washington, considering whether any settlement or compromise of the much talked of tax assessment cases should or could be arrived at. It has been known for ten days or two weeks that the Atlantic Coast Line was desirous of terminating the legislation.

Henry A. London of Pittsburg is made president pro tem, of the State Senate.

In the Superior Court here George Gooch, a white youth who in November shot his father, was acquitted, it being clearly shown that the homicide was justifiable and that he shot his father to save his mother's life, his father having attacked her.

The State charters the R. E. Jones Buggy Company of Goldsboro, capital \$10,000.

The Corporation Commission met today and called over the docket on which there were no important cases.

Arrivals.—H. G. Connor, of Wilson, H. B. Varner, of Lexington, State Labor Commissioner; Lt. Gov. elect W. D. Turner, who came upon the call of the Democratic Senate caucus, to make up the committees of that body.

The Republicans, 33 in all, caucused today. The Populists, 5 in all caucused today.

Senator A. W. Graham, of Granville, tells me that copper mining is very active in Person and Granville, and that 5 companies are at work now. There are large purchases of land by Boston, New York, Philadelphia, Pittsburg and Norfolk people and many new mines will be opened this year.

AGAINST SALE OR LEASE.
Commissioners and People of Lenoir County Oppose Lease or Sale of the A. & N. C. Railroad.

The Lenoir county commissioners on Monday, Jan. 7, adopted the following: Whereas, it is rumored that a proposition will be made to the general assembly of North Carolina, at its session in 1901, to purchase or lease the State's interest in the Atlantic and North Carolina Railroad Company.

And whereas, owing to the fact that it is deemed that a sale or lease of said railroad property would be detrimental to the interests of the people of the county of Lenoir, public sentiment in the county is opposed to such proposition, now, therefore be it

Resolved, by the board of commissioners of Lenoir county, that the representative from Lenoir county and the senator from the 9th judicial district be, and they are hereby requested, to oppose a lease or sale of said railroad property by the general assembly.—Kinston Free Press, Jan. 9th.

PASSED BY HOUSE.

Burleigh Bill Giving Increased Representation to States.

WASHINGTON, January 8.—By a vote of 195 to 101 the House today accepted the reapportionment plan proposed by the Burleigh bill, which increases the membership of the House during the next decade from 338, the present membership and the membership proposed by the Committee on Hopkins' bill, to 384.

The result was largely brought about by the influence of certain Senators from several of the larger Northern States, who threw the weight of their influence in the scale in favor of the larger membership. When it became apparent that these factors were at work against his bill, Mr. Hopkins attempted to compromise by giving an additional representative, each to North Dakota, Colorado and Florida, but his adversaries refused to compromise after complete victory was assured.

The Crumpacker proposition to recommit the bill for the purpose of ascertaining what States abridged the right to vote to an extent which would entail reduced representation was defeated, 130 to 110.

Under the bill, as passed today, no State loses a representative and the following make gains: Illinois, New York and Texas, three each; Minnesota, New Jersey and Pennsylvania, two each; Arkansas, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Florida, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Mississippi, Missouri, North Carolina, North Dakota, Washington, West Virginia and Wisconsin, one each. The bill provides that whenever a new State is admitted the representative assigned to it shall be in addition to the number provided in the bill. It also adds a provision, never hitherto incorporated in a reapportionment bill, to the effect that Congressional districts in addition to being "contiguous" shall also be "compact."

States which are allowed additional representatives by the bill shall by its terms elect them at large until the Legislature shall redistrict the State.

Weather Conditions.
Precipitation has increased during the past 24 hours, rain or snow falling from the extreme western states eastward to the New England coast. The cold area over the northwest has extended eastward into the upper lake region and southward to Oklahoma with temperature falls of from 8 to 32 degrees. The temperature is generally slightly higher in the eastern and southern sections.

A low pressure area has formed over western Texas attended by increasing cloudiness in the West Gulf States.
