RALEIGH.

Anti-Trust Fight Will be Active in Legislature.

Superintendents of City Schools Meet. Bill Against Lobbying. Meeting Confederate Veterans. Hospitals Want Big Appropriations.

RALEIGH, January 18.—The annual meeting of the North Carolina association of Superintendents of City schools began here this afternoon. Heretofore the meetings have been held the last week in December, but this year there was a postponement. Prof. G. A. Grimes of Greensboro is presiding and Prof. W. C. Lane of High Point is secretary. The association has about 20 members.

The bill which was yesterday introduced by Senator Aycock, providing for State adoption of school books, for a term of 5 years, is practically the Tennessee law, and resembles the Texas law.

Snow fell again today. The wheat growers have for weeks hoped for a good fall of snow, as it would benefit that crop which the frequent frozes have hurt.

Gov. Aycock has requested a lieutenant general register and quartermaster general Mason to continue on duty until he decides whether he will or not make any changes.

It is very notable that the Republican and Populist papers have words of commendation of Gov. Aycock's inaugural address.

Willard's bill in the house, to prevent lobbying is along a good line, but it does not appear probable that it can be made effective. The lobbying is done not so much in the actual lobby itself as at hotels and boarding houses and on the streets. Of course there is much done in the lobbies.

The matter of properly ventilating the capitol is attracting attention. Some members say they desire air ducts and fans which will furnish fresh air to all the officers as well as the legislature halls, but they say this will cost \$15,000.

The committee decides to favorably report Senator Brown's bill to forbid the sale of cigarettes in North Carolina. There will certainly be a fight on this measure. The American Tobacco Company will materially take a hand, and so do not will the anti-trust manufacturers also.

Commander Alex B. Stronach of the L. O. B. branch camp of Confederate Veterans of this city says the meeting or rather the convention of Confederate veterans to be held here on the 30th inst to consider the matter of pensions and an increase of appropriations for the Soldiers' Home promises to be a very interesting one and that it is important there should be a full attendance of representative men from the different veteran organizations. The citizens of Raleigh, whose hospitality is unbounded will through L. O. B. branch camp entertain the delegates. It is important that delegates should forward their names at once to Commander Stronach or to J. C. Birdsong, the camp adjutant.

About 15 years ago a bill was introduced in the legislature providing that all executions should take place in the penitentiary. The bill had not a few merits, but it died on the calendar. Willard's bill, introduced yesterday, is to the same effect.

While it is unconstitutional, it seems to levy a direct tax on dogs, a privilege tax can be imposed. There will be a strenuous movement to get such a law. The bill to that end is now being drawn.

The eastern hospital for the insane asks the legislature for \$170,000, the one here for \$140,000 and the one at Goldsboro \$100,000.

The Anti-Trust fight is just beginning in the legislature. In a fortnight it will make a stir.
