### SEEK SETTLEMENT.

Railroads Willing to Have Tax Case Adjusted.

State Normal School Needs Funds. Report Board Internal Improvements on Atlantic and North Carolina Against Sale of Property.

RALPH, N. C., January 19.—President Warren Elliott of the Wilmington and Weldon Railway came here last evening and had a conference last night with chairman McNeill of the corporation commission and Hon. H. G. Connor, regarding the terms upon which the pending suits as to the assessment of railroads may be compromised, settled and terminated. Chairman McNeill said this morning he had as yet nothing to give out, as matters were not completely adjusted. He appeared to be well pleased with the progress of the matter.

President Charles D. McIver of the State Normal and Industrial College for women is here. He says good progress is being made in raising the \$100,000 endowment, which is to be used in aiding needy students, and that Guilford gives \$10,000 of the amount.

He says the Legislature will be asked to pay the debt which the college incurred by reason of the epidemic of typhoid fever last year, amounting to some \$15,000. The college work had to stop two months the bills of physicians and nurses were something like \$800 a week, all the bedding had to be destroyed and another system of plumbing installed and a new supply provided. Provision is also asked for a practice school at the college. Prof. McIver says this college is the only one in the State which, year after year, has to turn away applicants for admission, for lack of room. It has over 400 students and this year has declined many applications.

It is said that there is a strong and growing sentiment in favor of the issue of bonds in aid of public schools.

The negroes, of all classes, express great admiration of Gov. Aycock's inaugural address.

The State today chartered the Pilot Furniture Company, of Pilot Mountain. The biennial report of the State board of internal improvements was today placed in the Governor's hands. It deals with the status of the Atlantic & North Carolina railway. The board was created to take control of that road out of Gov. Russell's hands. Your correspondent last week gave all the salient features of the report. The latter is a powerful argument against the sale of the Atlantic & North Carolina railway and makes the fact clear that a sale would be an act of folly.

The annual State convention of superintendents of city public schools ended here today. Twenty five superintendents attended. It was at once the largest and best meeting yet held.

### THE LEGISLATURE.

#### Adjourment Out of Respect of Gen. Lee. A Few Bills Introduced.

RALPH, Jan. 19.—The Legislative session lasted barely an hour today, there being an adjournment until Monday as a mark of respect to the memory of Robert E. Lee, and the day being a legal holiday.

A bill was introduced in the Senate to regulate primary elections.

Resolution was adopted inviting Dr. J. M. L. Curry to address the Legislature. Senator Guider who is from the 9th Congressional district caused outburst and sensation by voting "No" and then stated that he did so, because he understood that Dr. Curry had lobbied at Washington, to unseat Congressman W. T. Crawford who was elected, and to unseat Richmond Pearson who was not elected.

The bill forbidding the sale of cigarettes was ordered printed.

### QUEEN VICTORIA ILL.

#### News Alarms London And Affects Stock Exchange

OSBORNE ISLAND OF WIGHT, Jan. 18.—The following official announcement regarding Queen Victoria's health has been made:

"The Queen during the last year has had a great strain upon her powers, which has rather told upon her nervous system. It has, therefore, been thought advisable by her Majesty's physicians that her Majesty should be kept perfectly quiet in the house and should abstain from the present form of transacting business."

LONDON, Jan. 18.—Rumors were circulated here today to the effect that Queen Victoria is seriously ill and that her family has been summoned to Osborne. The rumors alarmed the public and adversely affected the Stock Exchange.

According to telegrams from Cowes, Isle of Wight, the Queen was not well yesterday and had not improved today. She has been suffering from influenza.

Sir Francis Laking, Surgeon to her Majesty, has been called in to consult with Sir James Reid, her Majesty's resident physician.

Assurances are given by the Foreign Office that there is no reason for apprehension regarding the Queen's life.

The Prince of Wales is now at Marlborough House. The Duke of York, his eldest son, has gone to Sandringham.
