IT IS REPORTED.

Bill For Impeachment Comes Before the House.

Special Order for Next Thursday. Time for Minority Report. Bill to Take Insurance Companies out of Craiz Law.

Raleigh, Feb. 8.—The resolution of impeachment of Supreme Court Judges Furches and Douglas was reported favorably in the House by Allen of Wayne, who asked, at the request of Representatives Ebbs and Blythe, Republicans, that the resolution be postponed and made a special order of business for next Thursday.

This is so as to give time to prepare and file a minority report.

All the evidence in the case has been ordered printed. It was 12:30 this morning after a long session, that the House judiciary committee, 37 members present, adopted the resolution in favor of impeaching Judges Furches and Douglas, by a vote of 22 to 10, some not voting. Speeches against impeachment were made by Connor, Whitaker, of Guilford, and Ebbs, the latter a Republican, and in favor of impeachment by Rountree, Spainhour and others.

All who voted in favor of the resolution based their action entirely on the report of the sub-committee, which was unanimous and which was signed by the five members of the sub-committee—Allen, Connor, Craig, Spainhour and Graham.

The bill passed the House taking insurance companies out of the Craiz de-mercation law and revoking the licenses of those removing their cases from the State to the Federal courts or suing citizens of North Carolina in Federal courts.

Valuable Paintings Seized.
New York, Feb. 7.—Twelve valuable paintings received here from Paris, a week ago, have been seized by the port authorities on the charge that the valuation of \$4000 was so low as to amount to a fraud on the customs. They were consigned to Michael Van Gelder.

Among the pictures are two by Rubens, one of which represents the Holy Family, said to be worth more than the inventor value of the entire collection. Other artists represented include Botticelli, Velasquez and Goussier. Experts declare that \$15,000 is a modest estimate of the value of the works.

UNDER FIRE.

The Proposed Impeachment Discussed On All Sides.

Some Believe It Will Go Through Senate Will Go Slow. Law-yers Generally Opposed. Connor's Substitute.

RALEIGH, N. C., Feb. 8.—To the opponents of impeachment of Judges Furches and Douglas the action of the House judiciary committee, after midnight last night in deciding to report favorably today, by a vote of 22 to 10, the Craiz resolution for impeachment was rather a surprise. They felt quite sanguine that after "wasting time," so to speak they would win. A member of the committee said to your correspondent today: "I expect the House to declare for impeachment, when the resolution comes up next Thursday. I expect the Senate to impeach. I think the whole matter will go through and that the Judges will be removed from office. It would be a reflection upon the House and bad politics as well for the Senate not to take this course, after the House like a grand jury has made a presentment after a fair and impartial hearing of evidence. I want to say that I favor and I believe a majority of the committee favor not the extreme penalty disfranchisement and the forfeiture of right to hold office but merely removal from office. I think the matter will go to the Senate by next Friday and think it will take a week for the proceedings in the Senate."

The resolution has to run the gauntlet of the House and the Senate also. A Senator said a day or two ago that that body would be entirely conservative and dispassionate in this whole matter. Senators have talked and been talked to very little about it.

A member of the House said today: "We thought the judges would resign. That matter was talked about. The only time politics has been mentioned in this case during a committee session was after the telegram which Pritchard and the Republican Congressmen sent the judges. I know there are Republicans who want us to impeach them. I know there is politics in the matter."

As a rule nearly all lawyers oppose impeachment as unwise, impolitic and out of proportion to the offense, but one who came in today, and who is a well known politician said: "My kind of Democracy is the kind which makes me shoot a Republican whenever I see him. That is why I am in favor of getting these judges off the bench."

Representative Connor tells me he will present his substitute for the impeachment resolution Thursday. He is the leader of the anti-impeachment forces and is ably aided by Stubbs. A Senator tells me an anti-cigarrette bill will be introduced in a day or two which will certainly pass. It prohibits the sale, gift or offer of cigarrettes or cigarette paper or any substitute therefor, to any minor.
