NEW BILLS.

The Oyster Bill Passes And is a Complete Law.

Bills to Amend Charter of New Bern. Homestead Law Bill Amended. Bill to Exempt Tram Roads From Penalty.

Special to Journal. RALEIGH, February 22.—The Oyster bill was passed in the House today. It is the most complete oyster law the State has ever had. It allows a rebate of one half cent per bushel. It was stated in the House that canners and packers had avoided taxation in every conceivable way.

A bill was introduced in the Senate to amend the charter of New Bern.

Bills were introduced in the the House to prevent the use of profane language in the presence of women, to incorporate the Raleigh and Virginian Railway, to incorporate the Thomasville and Eldorado Railway. The bill to charter the State Veterinary Association was tabled.

In the Senate the bill was passed making important amendments in the homestead law, with an amendment that the statute of limitations shall be suspended not only as to judgments under which homestead is allotted but as to all other judgments.

A bill was passed chartering the New River valley railroad; a bill passed giving council of State the entire control of State printing. A bill was passed entirely revising the private corporation laws. It imposes a graduated tax on incorporations.

The Senate adjourned in honor of the memory of Washington.

A bill was passed in the House protecting game birds in Currituck county. To exempt tram roads and lumber roads from penalty for carrying freight for farm use. The code commission bill was reported favorably.

The finance committee fixes the total amount of the railroad franchise tax on the basis of mileage at \$17,000. This is satisfactory to the railroads. No tax on dealers in organs, pianos, sewing machines and cigarettes is yet agreed on.

The bill to prohibit the raising of Spanish peanuts on the State farms is favorably reported. This was decided after argument. Halifax and the adjoining counties raise three-fourths of all the Spanish peanuts grown in the United States.

The propositions and grievances committee of the House has reported all bills unfavorably, providing for furnishing back volumes of the Supreme Court Reports to counties.

ATLANTA, Feb. 21.—Fire in the wholesale district entailing a loss of half a million dollars, on which there was insurance amounting to nearly \$400,000, occurred this morning. The burned area is bounded by Railroad avenue and Lloyd, Decker and Collins streets. The principal losses were J. J. & J. E. Meddow, wholesale grocers, \$150,000; Granting & Spaulding Shoe Company, \$70,000; Deaver-Coggins Shoe Company, \$70,000; Arnold Halsey, \$71,000; Princeton Paper Company, \$43,000; McConnell & Christopher, dry goods, \$21,000; Dickson & Davidson, hardware \$11,000.

THE PENSION BILL.

Its Chief Features Comes up Today. The Soldiers Home Bill.

RALEIGH, February 22.—The pension bill, introduced by London in the Senate, comes up tomorrow at noon as a special order. London says its three chief features are, first, it provides that a soldier who did duty during the war and is now incapacitated must receive a pension; second, that a widow to be pensionable must have been married prior to April 1, 1895, and thus receive a pension in appreciation of the services in taking care of the home while the husband was in the field; third, all the four grades of pensions shall be prorated equally and not, as heretofore, make the deficiency fall on the fourth class alone.

The soldiers Home bill was to have been reported today, but Julian S. Carr is to be given a special hearing on it, hence it is delayed.

The following reply was received: "Topeka, Kas., 21.—Will you ever see anything that smashes our feelings?"

Topeka Kas., Feb. 21.—Mrs. Carrie Nation is to enter politics and become the editor of the "Free Smasher" Mill, a paper to be run in behalf of negroes. She has refused tempting offers to go on the stage, and will remain in Topeka to help elect a "clean man" for mayor at the spring election.

These matters were announced by the traveler from her cell in the county jail today, after the charge against her of smashing the Senate Saloon, two weeks ago, had been dismissed by Judge McCabe. She is still being held on the charge of breaking into M. Lee's cold storage plant last Sunday.

Filipino Helped by Frenchmen. MEXICO, Feb. 21.—At Payson Province of Laguna, yesterday, Lieutenant Vaughan, of the Thirty-seventh Infantry, arrested Fernando Rostas, general agent of the Tabacalera Company, on the charge of having aided the insurgents. Abundant evidence has been secured.

Rostas is a French subject and a close friend of the insurgent General Calles, and was to a certain extent associated with O. M. Carranza, the American contractor, held for, aiding the insurgents.

Freshmen Get Punished. Princeton, N. J., Feb. 22.—Last night some freshmen painted their class numbers, 1901, in large orange figures on the steps of Blair Hall, and placed a similar decoration on a Pennsylvania passenger coach which lay alongside the station during the night.

Today they paid up for their fun. Sophomores set gangs to "freshen" the work with all manner of noisier implements, and were not content until every trace of the paint was effaced. In this the sophomores were approved by the university president, who used the "freshen" as an instrument of chastisement for the freshmen's infringement of college laws.
