

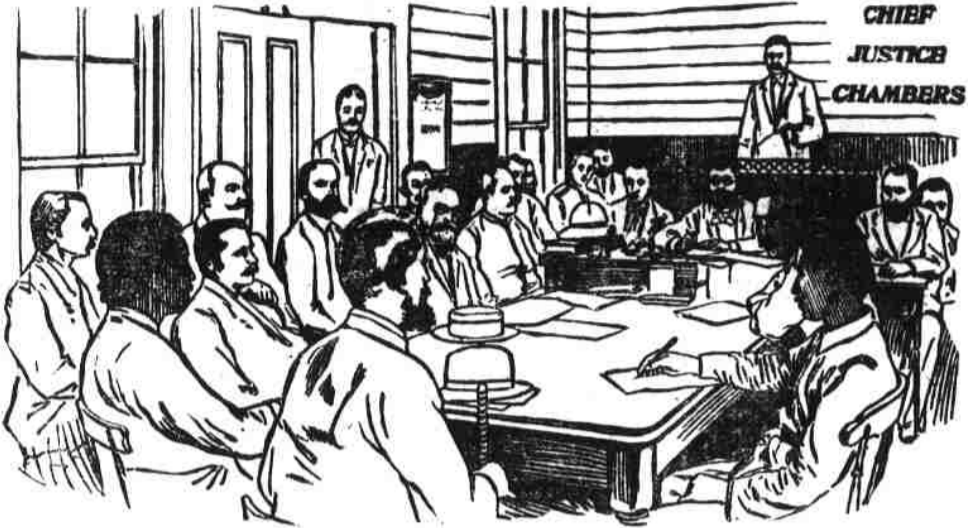

## THE LEGISLATURE.

Consolidation to Relieve "A. & M. College. Normal College for Wilson. A Game Warden For the State.

Special to Journal. RALEIGH, March 2.—There is to be a bill to consolidate the department of agriculture and the Agricultural and Mechanical College. Persons who know say the sole motive is to give the college money; that it is in straits for funds, and so is the State Treasury. Of course the income of the department is derived entirely from the sale of tax tags on fertilizers. For some years a large part of its revenues was diverted to the college and it was very much on this account that there was a suit in the federal court and an injunction by Judge Seymour. The fashionist board of agriculture asked to lead the college money, and also arranged matters so as to pay the college for making the analyses of fertilizers, while really the college never made them at all, as they were made in the department's laboratory. It was merely a scheme to give the agricultural department's money to the college.

In certain quarters pressure is brought to bear in favor of the bill to give Wilson a Normal College for women like that at Greensboro. It is said, however, that the odds are greatly against its passage. There is a movement for a bill to make the commissioner of agriculture game warden and have him look after not only the protection but the propagation of game. He is placed in charge of fish culture and the hatchery to be established near Avon. It is to be under his control and direction.

## NEW BILLS.

Special School Tax for the Races Referred to Committee.

Bill to Prevent Gambling. First Compulsory Education Bill. To Prevent Sunday Trains. Apportionment For Representatives.

Special to Journal. RALEIGH, March 2.—The Senate today discussed the bill to amend the constitution of the State by allowing whites or negroes to vote a special school tax for schools of their own race. There was a claim that the bill was unconstitutional and it is referred to the Judiciary Committee.

There was considerable discussion upon the bill to prevent gambling. The bill is a particularly drastic one, regarding gambling in bar rooms. One penalty for the violation of the act is the revocation of the proprietor's license forever, while if a policeman is aware of gambling places and does not do his duty he is deprived forever of the right to hold that office. The bill passed, although it came up with an unfavorable report from the committee, and all the amendments to the bill were voted down.

The bill passed for compulsory attendance at school in Mitchell county of children between the ages of 8 and 15 years. It is the first compulsory education bill that has ever passed in North Carolina.

A bill was introduced in the House today to prohibit Sunday trains from running. The bill for re-apportioning representatives in the lower house also passed. An effort was made to take one representative from Sampson county, which is a Populist stronghold, but it failed. The apportionment as made is entirely based on the last census.

## CONFEDERATE DESERTERS.

Valuable Book Found. Many Now Drawing Pensions.

There were prepared during the civil war books containing lists of deserters, one for each of the ten Congressional districts. One of these books was found yesterday and it shows that 29 deserters have for years been receiving pensions. Search was made 16 years ago for these books. It will now be renewed. They are State property. This one was found in private hands.

## REDISTRICTING.

Greatest Possible Difference of Opinion on the Result.

All Democratic to Four Republican is Claimed. Moore Sure of the 10th. Day to Adjourn Uncertain.

RALEIGH, March 2.—There are all sorts of expressions of opinion, some of them too harsh for publication, about the proposed Congressional and Judicial redistricting of the State. The views range all the way from Josephus Daniels' positive declaration that all 10 Congressional districts will be Democratic to Representative John S. Headerson's equally positive one that four will go Republican. Senator Justice said today: "The tenth as arranged, we stand a good chance to carry. If we can carry that it really looks like in the other districts we ought to hold our own, which means we ought to carry them when the constitutional amendment goes into operation."

It is further asserted that if the constitutional amendment "holds" and if it disfranchises many negroes as it is expected it will, the Democrats ought to have no trouble.

It is said that speaker Moore of the House is to be the Democratic Congressional candidate in the 10th and that he is sanguine as to carrying it. It is also said that representative Allen of Wayne will be a candidate for Congress in a Judge-ship in his district.

The legislators appear to be at sea as to any date of adjournment, of the regular 90 days of session there now remain but 7. It is asserted by not a few that the Senate can hardly dispose of the impeachment of the judges before March 31 and that the House must nevertheless sit as long as the Senate, as one branch cannot sit alone.

Senator Marion Butler and family will arrive here Tuesday and will occupy the residence in which Judge Montgomery has until recently lived. The latter now lives in the country. The good roads here are increasing the desire to live in the country.
