THE LEGISLATURE.

A Number of Bills Introduced at Yesterday's Session.

One Price Railway Fare Bill Tabled More Dispensary Bills. School Bill Passed. Speaker Stevenson of S. C. Introduced.

Special to Journal. RALEIGH, March 5.—The bill to make only one class of passenger fares was tabled today. It would have abolished first and second class rates and made a uniform rate of three cents a mile. It was favored by the railroad companies.

Several new dispensary bills were introduced today. One of these provides for a dispensary for Washington, Beaufort county. The school bill passed the House practically as it came from the Senate. The only amendment to the bill provided that county boards of education should have the authority to allow County Superintendents to teach.

The bill for reorganizing the Agricultural Department and making the commissioner of agriculture its head passed.

The bill incorporating the Kenansville Air Line Railway passed.

A bill was introduced in the Senate making it a misdemeanor, with a penalty of fine and forfeiture of license, for a guarantee company to compel a county officer to deposit funds in National banks alone.

The bill which passed the Senate yesterday creating three State Supervisors of education was called back from the House and referred.

William F. Stevenson, speaker of the South Carolina House, was invited to a seat beside speaker Moore and he was introduced to the House. He is a brother of representative Stevenson of Ireland county.

STATE FARMS.

The Anson Farm Abandoned as it Has Not Paid.

Act Giving Preference to Certain Graduates Repealed. Stronach Got No Salary. An Old Prisoner Discharged.

RALEIGH, March 5.—Senator Travis, who is chairman of the penitentiary executive board, which today expired by limitation, says the 60 convicts on the Anson farm near Wadesboro have been nearly all removed to the farms on the Roanoke, leaving only 10, who will cultivate about 100 acres. The Anson farm is practically abandoned. Travis says it has never paid. The lease does not expire until 1906 but he says an arrangement has been made with the owner by which after this year part of the rental will be remitted. Some of the convicts are transferred to the Caledonia farm, which the State owns, and some to the Tillery farms which it leases. The legislature not having passed the bill placing the penitentiary under new management, the present officials will necessarily have to hold over for a day or two.

A bill was favorably reported to the legislature repealing the act giving to graduates of the State Normal and Industrial college, the Asheville college and the Calloway school exemption from examination as teachers.

President Harry Jordan of the Interstate Cotton Growers Association writes that he will soon be in North Carolina, for the purpose of thoroughly organizing this State.

A Mannerly rifle captured by our troops in China, was today presented to the State Museum by Surgeon Paul C. Huston.

It is said that but little work is now in progress at the coal mines at Cumbock.

Under the impression that the late W. C. Stronach got a salary as manager of the soldiers home, there were today applicants for the place, while some persons pressed the claims of a legislator for the position. There is no salary.

It is said there is a movement to put private corporations under the jurisdiction of the corporation commission, so far as assessment for taxation is concerned.

Audy Wisnecoff, colored, who since 1876 has been in the penitentiary here, was discharged today, his time having expired. He was one of the once noted Henry Berry Lowery gang of desperadoes in Robeson county. He is now about 56 years old. He did not care to leave the prison. He has been a good prisoner and very useful.

THE SOLDIERS' HOME.

Bill Under Discussion. Queer Management of the Home Developed.

Special to Journal. RALEIGH, March 5.—The house committee on Soldiers' Home this morning considered the Senate bill appropriating \$13,000 annually for maintenance and \$5000 this year for a new dormitory and for repairs and improvements of the other buildings, and decided to report the bill favorably.

The fact developed that since the home was opened as a State institution in 1891 no report has ever been made to the State. The committee adopted a provision to the bill requiring annual report to the Governor and also an annual meeting of the directors, it being discovered that the latter has never, in the last 10 years, held more than one meeting, and that the lady managers have never met. The government of the home will be under an entirely new system.
