THE QUESTION OF POLITICAL REPRISAL.

The disfranchisement acts passed in several Southern States, whereby the illiterate voter is eliminated, seems to be giving some concern to Northern politicians.

Representative Charles Dick, of Ohio, a gentleman high in Republican councils, is reported to have recently said in regard to this question:

"The Republicans can not fail to take cognizance of the political thefts which have taken place in North Carolina, South Carolina, Louisiana, Mississippi, and recently in the State of Maryland. Unless drastic action is taken as soon as possible we may expect West Virginia, Virginia, Kentucky and almost every other Southern or border State where Democrats have control to adopt the disfranchisement method of perpetuating their party in power. There is no telling where this thing would stop."

So far as the accusation of these disfranchisement acts being political thefts is concerned, it really amounts to nothing, that is accepting Mr. Dick's argument, that on account of this disfranchisement, the Republican party has lost.

Taking the State governments of the States mentioned, the new law barring illiterates, in no way affects their political status. They were Democratic before, they are Democratic now. In the matter of representation, it can hardly be said that the Republican party is to lose by the political charge, in cutting off illiterates.

As an illustration, North Carolina, has never been much of a contributor of Republican representatives of Washington, and today, with the constitutional Amendment passed, there is even greater concern among the Democratic leaders, lest the elimination of the negro vote shall result in Republican gains, on account of the commercial interests of the State being so much concerned in the Protection policy, as advocated by the Republican party.

Mr. Dick says further, "I am heartily in favor of the passage of a bill which will reduce the representation of all these States both in Congress and in the Electoral College to an extent proportionate to the number of voters disfranchised."

This matter of political reprisal, which Mr. Dick favors, will in no way affect the people of those States who have voted for the disfranchisement of illiterates.

This act was a local necessity, demanded by local environment, and not governed by politics altogether, for Republicans urged as strongly, and voted as readily, as did Democrats for the measure.

And the Journal predicts that within a few years, with the continued influx of the negro into Ohio and other Northern States, there will be the same demand for a disfranchisement act in those States, not for political reasons perhaps, but for social and economic reasons, and there will be no hesitation in passing this act, even by those who now stand and criticize others for having done so.

STRIKERS NOW BOSSES.

Millions of men and their families are now running a big co-operative mill. Seeing no other way to supply the union carpenters of the city with mill material and falling to induce the mills to start up on the eight hour basis, the strikers decided to raise the money to build a mill of their own with the assistance of organized labor.

The unions have now erected the biggest mill in the state of California. The wheels of this concern are running on full time, and its perfect machinery is turning out eight hour mill work as fast as 2,000 union carpenters can place it on the buildings in the city. The mill is equipped with the best machinery in the market.

Three shifts of 75 men each run the mill night and day.

This is the first time in the history of organized labor where such an effort was put forward to win a strike.

The new concern is owned by the Progressive Planning Mill company, a corporation formed by delegates representing the various local unions in the city that have subscribed for the stock. It was chartered with a capital of \$100,000, or 20,000 shares at \$5 per share, which were sold only to bona fide local unions and not to individual members. The company is entirely free from debt. Cash has been paid for everything purchased to date. The value of the plant is about \$25,000.

Some of the employers are offering as high as \$7 per day to any of their old, experienced hands who will return to work, but the men are determined not to go back until they get the eight hour day.

The instrument was inclosed in a leather case, so arranged that Mrs. Nation may carry it handily when on her crusades.
