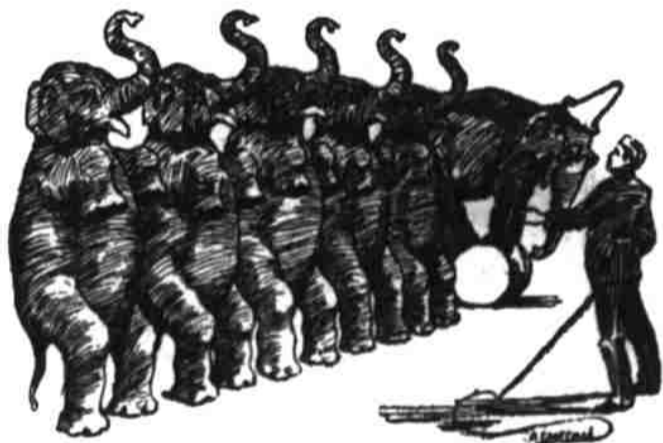

### INSPECT ROADS.

New Board of Internal Improvement  
Holds a Meeting.

Will Take up A. & N. C. Railroad  
Matters. Pearsall Made Secretary, Trial of Maj. Martin Creates Interest.

RALPH, April 2.—The newly appointed State Board of Internal Improvements met in the Governor's office today. The Governor presided as ex-officio chairman. The members of the board are B. C. Beckwith of Raleigh and B. W. Ballard of Franklington. The board has to do with the Atlantic and North Carolina and North Carolina railroads, in which the State has an interest. It did nothing today but organize, electing P. M. Pearsall secretary. Its first work will be an inspection of the Atlantic and North Carolina railway.

The murder trial of a deputy sheriff here has drawn considerable crowds, but the real event of the week will be the trial of Maj. W. H. Martin, the defaulting ex-clerk at the state treasury, whose thefts are found this far to aggregate \$15,000 from the penitentiary fund alone. Martin was in the office four years. When, after the discovery of his stealing, ex-treasurer Worth asked him if he had been stealing the entire four years, he replied that he did not remember. He declared with great positiveness, however, that he had stolen only the fund. Ex-Gov. Russell a few days ago told your correspondent that two years ago he had said to treasurer Worth that he suspected Martin and would not have him in his office. Martin's reputation for clerical skill and honesty was high however. His relations with women were the true cause of his crime and ruin.

### Big Army Not Needed.

WASHINGTON, April 1.—Officials expect that the capture of Aguinaldo, and the surrender of other Filipino officers and men will make it unnecessary to keep as large an army in the Philippines as was planned for when Congress passed the Army bill, and if reports from Gen. MacArthur and the Philippine Commission, bear out those expectations, orders are likely to be issued limiting the number of men to be recruited under that law, which provides for a regular army 100,000. What the limit will be, will, of course, depend upon future reports.

### ORIENTAL.

A Growing Place. Some of Its Features. The Midytic Hotel. A Tracking Section. Many Visitors.

ORIENTAL, April 1.—This is a thriving little village in Pamlico county, about thirty miles below New Bern on the Neuse river, at or near the mouth of Smith's Creek, where it was founded about eight years ago so we learned, and up to four years ago, there was only a population of about 150 people, now there are 112 families, and a population of near 600 souls, with several progressive enterprises, and more in view.

Among those already in operation are, three saw mills, two dredge boats, seven stores with goods, half dozen more to commence soon, livery stables, oyster factory, one fine church, M. E. South, three others, Missionary Baptist, Disciples and Free Will or Christian church under construction, one prosperous Sunday School, with a membership of 106 pupils and 15 officers and teachers, a splendid school, and an excellent Acad-my building, not quite finished, with a regular attendance of 60 pupils at this time, Wheelright, Blacksmith shop, Telephone office lines from here to New Bern and Washington N. C., and Norfolk Va., line of steamers, Old Dominion Steam Ship Company daily, also Southern and Norfolk lines, etc.

Of the 600 population, only about 40 are colored people. The town is incorporated and laid off in beautiful streets and squares, and the lots are being taken up very fast. Mr. D. W. Dill is the efficient Mayor, J. W. Aldridge, Constable; P. C. Paris, T. J. Delemar and G. W. Midgett are the commissioners, one more, we don't remember the name; There is only one thing really needed at this time, that is a larger hotel; L. B. Midgett, one of the founders of the place in fact, the principal founder with his family and brothers, etc. keep the only hotel in the place, others do a small business in that line; Mr. M. told us he had to climb a tree to take the bearing and site for the house he first built here; the site is beautiful, almost sea level for miles around, and the farming lands are very rich; trucking is the main work in the farming line, about 200 acres of cabbage; 50 in beans, 100 in peas, 100 in Irish potatoes, 100 in sweet potatoes, 25 in onions, beside cotton, corn, etc., are being cultivated in and near the town this year.

Mr. G. R. Dixon a prosperous farmer near by, has 75 acres in cotton, 25 in corn, and 50 in truck, such as cabbage, Irish potatoes, onions, peas and early yellowbark potatoes, he has sprouts now ready to set out, having bedded them in February in hot beds, something new to us.

Mr. A. B. Aldridge another prominent farmer, has a very fine truck farm, so has Mr. J. H. Carmine a northern gentleman of note, Dr. J. A. Kyle, T. D. Hardy, G. W. Midgett, Robt. Midgett, Alex. Stephens and others are extensive farmers of truck, in fact, as a whole this seems to us to be the living town of Pamlico county in the near future, for a railroad is sure to come, and that soon. The people are all very clever and sociable, therefore it is bound to prosper and thrive with this rich soil and such good facilities for fishing, oystering, hunting etc., as well as farming. This is one of the best places in the state for fishing, oystering and hunting. If you want to invest money for profit, come to Oriental.

They were visiting Mr. and Mrs. L. J. Herring, the latter being a daughter and sister of the visiting party. Mr. Robt. O. McLean and family of Adams Creek, moved here last week. Mr. McL. works in the saw mill business.

The Post Office is kept by Mr. G. C. Haskins, a genial gentleman and prosperous merchant, formerly of Jones Co. Mr. W. F. Midgett is the only bachelor we have, he says he is ready to marry some rich widow, whose husband has been hung, or shot for horse stealing, or some other crime. Mr. M. is good looking and not over 45 years old, with lots of money. G. W. W.
