MORE WORK DONE.

Investigation Committee Has Figured Martin's Shortage at \$16,739.65

How Martin Transferred the Funds. The Gold Brick Men. The Exhibit at Charleston Will be a Fine One.

RALPH, April 19.—The Legislative Committee of Investigation of the State treasury today completed its work. Mr. Shannonhouse of the committee said: "I go home tomorrow and will, after a little rest, make up in about a week or ten days the report, which we will give to the governor. We will show that the defaulting ex-clerk Martin's stealings are \$16,739.65, from the penitentiary and that from those stealings he made his thefts from other institutions good."

Martin stole \$3250 from Insane asylum here, first \$100 at a time, making the amount of the checks that much greater than the figure on the stub; then \$800, then \$750. He destroyed the checks as fast as they came in. Then he paid all back in three payments with penitentiary funds, once \$1000, once \$750, the third-time \$500.

An effort is being made to have the ball for the three gold brick swindlers in jail at Greensboro made low, so their pals can put up the money and the men can get away never to reappear.

A preliminary outline for the North Carolina exhibit at the Charleston exposition has been prepared and placed in the governor's hands. It is very evident that this State is going to make a great exhibit. The governor manifests special interest in it. At the same meeting of the board of agriculture all the arrangements are to be perfected.

Minister Wu in Charlotte.

CHARLOTTE, N. C., April 18.—Mr. Wu Ting Fang, Chinese Minister, was the guest of honor at a dinner given tonight by the Southern Manufacturers Club, of which Mr. D. A. Tompkins, a member of the United States Industrial Commission, is president. He spoke on the cotton-goods trade in China. Senator John L. McLaurin, of South Carolina, was also a guest of the club.

Charles W. Dabney, president of the University of Tennessee, spoke on "The Possibilities in Cotton." Among other prominent guests was Senator Pritchard. In his address at the dinner tonight, Mr. Wu gave a general review of the trade conditions between the South and the Orient and of China's importance as a market for Southern goods.

Cotton Season Late.

New York, April 18.—R. G. Dun's review of April 20th will say:

Reports from numerous branches and many correspondents of R. G. Dun's & Co., in the cotton belt, indicate that cold weather, and, in most sections, incessant rains, have delayed planting for the new cotton crop. The season is about two weeks later. Acreage will exceed last year, though cancellation of some early orders for fertilizers show that the increase in acreage will not be as large as the higher price for cotton prevailing earlier in the year seemed to justify.

There is much difficulty in obtaining labor, hands being fully employed in commercial and industrial lines at higher wages. The cotton crop this year will cost at least one-eighth more to raise and gather than last year.

Big Anarchist Plot.

Buenos Ayres, ARGENTINA April 18.—Police of the town of Rosario, in the Argentine Province of Santa Fe, have seized papers which prove that a plot against the lives of the Emperor of Germany, the Czar of Russia, the King and Queen of Italy and the Count of Turin was recently laid in Patterson, N. J.

Whether any specific action has been taken to carry out the resolution of the Patterson Society for the assassination of the Czar and the Italian rulers, the police will not say. The German, Italian and Russian legations here have been put in possession of the facts.

Increase in Cotton Acreage.

RALPH, April 19.—The cotton dealers now express the belief that the increase in acreage of cotton in this State will be as great as 15 per cent. Their estimate now begins to agree quite well with that of the agricultural department of the State.

Gen. Wood Will Hold On.

WASHINGTON, April 19.—The President is said to have ordered Gen. Wood to come to Washington ahead of the committee of the Cuban Constitutional Convention, which will reach Washington early next week, in order that he might be on hand to hear what the Cubans had to say and to show them the high esteem in which he is held by the President.

It is said that the President's order was actuated by information received from Havana, saying that the Cubans knew perfectly well that so far as the Platt amendment was concerned it was useless for them to come to Washington and that their real object was to try to persuade the President to give them another military governor in place of Gen. Wood.

If that be their real object, they are wasting their time, as it is well known in Washington that every important action of Gen. Wood since he became governor of Cuba, has been known and approved in advance by the President, and that the President is so well pleased with Gen. Wood's administration of the affairs of the island that he intends to keep him there as long as we remain in control.

Nights in Africa.

London, April 18.—A dispatch from General Kitchener, dated at Pretoria Wednesday, says:

"Primer has occupied Bathfont, captured 18 prisoners and a number of rifles and ammunition. Douglass' column has occupied Dulstroom. Six Boers were killed. On our advance from Lydenburg the Boers blew up a long ton. Thirteen prisoners were captured. Elliott's division has brought in a large number of cattle."
