### HOW WAS IT?

A Leak Suspected in the Text Books Commission Report

Decried by Secretary Kestler, Negro Laborers, Bound North and Here Going. Report on Martin in Ten Days.

RALEIGH, May 3.--There is no end of talk regarding publication by certain newspapers of what purported to be an abstract of the report of the sub-commission on text books. Secretary Kestler, of that commission, told the State Superintendent of public instruction today that the report or summary given was inaccurate, as will be found when the report, now under seal, is opened next Monday. In the minds of the general public there is now an impression, as the State authorities know, that there has been a "leak" somewhere, betrayal of faith by some one of the ten sub-commissioners, but of course the report itself, if not like the published statement, will show these suspicions to have no foundation.

One of the questions now being asked here is whether the tree leaves will be full-grown by May 10. It has always been understood that by that date they are at their full size. If they do so this year their growth will have to be wonderfully rapid.

The railway people who had charge of the negro laborers who went North from here yesterday, to work in brick yards, had to watch the railway closely to prevent their leaving the party at Norfolk, which city is the Mecca of the average North Carolina negro. There can be no written contract in this State for laborers to go outside of it, so only a verbal agreement held these men. There is no longer any law against taking laborers out of the State. The act of 1889, forbidding that, was repealed in 1899.

About eighty negroes left for New York State and 25 women and 15 men left, to be employed as house servants. It is said that as many as 1,000 are wanted. Some white people dislike to see the negroes go away while many say they are glad. The latter view is generally that of the younger whites. It is said that perhaps a third of the negroes who go away return. A police officer who took a look at the departing negroes said most of them could well be spared; that he saw but few good ones in the bunch.

It will be 10 days before the report as to Maj. Martin's defection as a State treasury clerk is placed in the governor's hands. As yet no steps have been taken in regard to bringing suit against Martin's bondsmen for his shortage of nearly \$17,000.

He has collected in the Episcopal diocese in North and South Carolina over \$50,000 for paying the college debts. Last week he was at Philadelphia and there collected \$1,750 for St. Mary's.

### The Views are There.

WASHINGTON, May 3.--Oom Paul Kruger is still inclined to make a visit to the United States and Mr. Montagu White, who is the agent of the Door authorities in this country, is now in Washington trying to find out how the United States government would receive Mr. Kruger. Mr. Kruger would be received just as the Door envoys were a year or so ago, and as a prominent citizen from a foreign country would have a trouble in seeing the President. Has Mr. White forgotten how cordially the President received the Door envoys and how he embraced as he pointed out to them the beauty of the views from the White House windows? The same views are there and the President would doubtless enjoy pointing out their beauty to Oom Paul.

### DAMAGE IN THE WEST.

Peaches Killed in Macon County. Snow Remained Long. April Temperatures.

RALEIGH, May 3.--J. Frank Hay of Macon county, who arrived here today says the phenomenally cold weather last week killed practically all the peaches in his section, which is the largest peach growing section in the State. Apples escaped injury.  
W. C. Newland of Caldwell county is also here. He says he was in Mitchell county a few days ago and found snow 4 to 5 feet in depth in drifts. Snow yet remains there.  
The weather report for April shows what a remarkable month it was in this State; with the lowest temperatures on record and a mean temperature 5 degrees lower than the average for the month.

### New Hotel Project.

RALEIGH, May 3.--The movement for a new hotel here, especially for tourists from the North, has a fine start. It is probable that the \$100,000 needed will be raised in ten days. An option on the best site in the city has been secured.

### The Farmers Alliance.

### Rural Free Delivery.

RALEIGH, May 3.--There are now 11 rural free mail delivery routes established by the Post-office Department, while applications are pending for 53 more. South Carolina is ahead of this State. It has 30 routes established and is asking for 95 more.

PARIS, May 2.--Ristori the great tragedienne, is to be married again! As La Vie Illustrée, the authority for the announcement, says, she doubtless considers her eight-first birthday, which she is approaching, as an eighty-first spring.

The second husband is the Mayor of Turin, Signor Casazza, a Senator of the Italian Parliament, and a good deal younger than his intended partner.

When three months old Ristori made her debut on the stage, and at 14 years years of age was playing "Francesca di Rimini," to the delight of Italian provincialists.

### Trust in Straw Hats.

BALTIMORE, Md., May 2.--Samuel Rosenthal, Jr., of Strauss & Brothers, wholesale clothing manufacturers, heads a project to unite the straw hat manufacturing establishments of New York and Baltimore into a trust.

The new company will be known as the American Straw Hat Manufacturing Company, and will be incorporated under the laws of New Jersey, with a capital stock of \$12,000,000. Eighteen firms, according to the plans, will be included, 15 in New York and three in Baltimore.

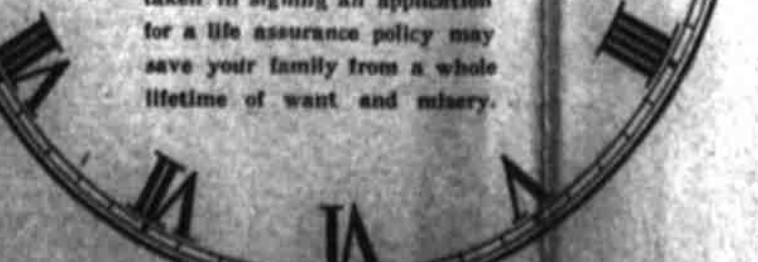
