RALEIGH.

Railroad Work in Progress.

Graduates at A. & M. College. Other Capitol News.

Raleigh, May 6.--Work is now in progress on some railways in this State, your correspondent is informed by Secretary Brown of the corporation commission. These are the Suffolk and Carolina's extension from Ryland to Edenton 17 miles, nearly completed; the Carolina and Northern from Lumberton, N. C. to Marion, S. C., 17 miles out of 45 completed; the Ohio River and Charleston, 10 miles built in the direction of Barnsville; the Great Eastern from Raleigh via Fremont and Snow Hill, grading in progress, no track-laying yet reported; the Tennessee and North Carolina, from New Port to Waynesville, 48 miles, of which 25 in North Carolina, work in progress from Tennessee end; Aberdeen and Rockport, being extended towards Fayetteville. East Carolina, built from Tarboro to Macfield, 12 miles, and going eastward.

It is extremely uncertain when the Supreme Court will adjourn. This term will certainly be longer than usual.

The State chartered today the Cook Lumber Co. of Greensboro, capital \$100,000, E. P. Wharton and a number of others stockholders.

There will be 39 graduates at the Agricultural and Mechanical College this year. The exercises of commencement are to be held in the Academy of Music. The venerable Mr. Wyatt, who died here last week, was the son of a Revolutionary soldier. One other son of a Revolutionary soldier remains here, Mr. Alfred Moring.

The accounts of the sub-commission on the text books have all been paid. They aggregate \$1,808.44.

There are now four electric lamps at the base of the Confederate monument, at the west entrance to the capital, each having three lights. It is probable that these will be removed and placed along the driveway in the grounds of the Agricultural and Mechanical College and that cannon balls will be placed on the base of the monument instead.

More work in progress at the State University than ever before at one time, President Venable tells me this being in the way of new buildings, improvements and repairs.

Saturday evening at the Agricultural and Mechanical College the Leazar Literary Society held its ninth oratorical contest for undergraduates. Friday evening the society gave the annual german. In compliment to the young ladies of Raleigh. More than 60 couples danced.

The "sneak bill" regarding the shipments of logs passed all its readings in the House in a few minutes, on the same day, as the record shows. It was, of course, merely read by its title.

TO EXHIBIT TRUCK.

Plan by Secretary Bruner to Help Eastern Growers.

Raleigh, May 4.--Arrangements are made by Secretary Bruner of the Agricultural Department for a fine show of North Carolina truck at Charlotte and Raleigh.

Two days will be used at each place to display the exhibit. Only one crate or full package is expected from one grower. All shipments are to be made May 20th.

The East Carolina truck and fruit growers Association will co-operate in the work. The purpose of the exhibit is to educate the central and western people as to the merits of eastern truck and stimulate the market for the products of the east.

The Bids are Opened.

Raleigh, May 6.--The text book commission opened the report of the sub-commission today, but will not make it public until the text books are adopted. The bids also were opened. There are 18 bidders, including one for school furniture. All these will be given a hearing Wednesday which will occupy all day.

A PARDON GRANTED.

Rancy Mills, Whose Husband Killed Flack is Pardoned by Governor Aycock.

Raleigh, May 6.--Governor Aycock today pardoned Rancy Mills, the young negro woman of Rutherford county who has a baby eight months old. Her husband Avery Mills killed a white man named Flack last year and was quickly lynched. The woman narrowly escaped lynching.

Judge Robinson urged her pardon. He says in a letter to the Governor, that after her husband had been shot and while he was being beaten on the head with a gun she handed him at his request a pistol with which he killed Flack whom Judge says was the aggressor. She and her husband were on the way to jail when he was lynched.

She was a witness before the grand jury against the lynchers but the grand jury ignored the bill as to lynchers and found bill against her for murder in the first degree. Judge Shaw thereupon issued bench warrants against the men she identified as lynchers. Some of them fled, and the warrants are yet unexecuted, though at this term of court the solicitor sent in another bill against them which the grand jury again ignored.

Judge Robinson removed the case against her to Cleveland county where Judge Robinson tried it. The jury found her guilty of murder in the second degree. Judge Robinson said he would set the verdict aside but decided to minimum term and then for first time while judge, asked for a pardon. The case is a very notable one.
