RALIGH.

Special Building for School of Observation at State Normal.

Wake Forest College Interest. Farmers Clearing Crops. Hesse Ball Cranks in the Ed. Friction in Fire Department.

RALIGH, June 8.—The board of trustees of the State Normal and Industrial College for women at Greensboro orders the erection of a special building for the School of practice and observation, at a cost not to exceed \$18,000. The building now used for this purpose will be converted into a dormitory and this will give room for about 75 more students, bringing the number up to nearly 900. It room were provided the number could easily be brought up to 1000.

The executive committee of the board of trustees of Wake Forest College, in session here, elected C. C. Ortenden instructor in the gymnasium, making his salary \$1000. He is also an instructor in pedagogy. A committee composed of William Bailey, Cary Hunter and Wesley N. Jones was created, to make recommendations for the immediate establishment of a medical school. It is the plan to have this in operation this year. H. C. Dockery, George Norwood and J. O. Caddell were appointed a committee to arrange for the complete electric lighting of the buildings and grounds, so the plant will be ready by the beginning of the next term.

This week an immense amount of work has been done by farmers in the cleaning of crops. Where there was hard work and a supply of labor the result is almost wonderful but in not a few cases the weeds and grass still have the mastery.

The State board of education may meet next week to elect the 8 public examiners. Some persons have an idea that the Governor appoints these. This is an error.

Gen. Toon, State superintendent of instruction went to Winston yesterday to see some special work being done at the State Normal school, colored. A teacher from New York is there, instructing 40 teachers in normal work, and also in industrial work. Using the ordinary wire grass, for example, all sorts of salable articles are made.

Gen. Toon today received a report on the work of the negro State Normal school at Elizabeth City which greatly gratified him. He says it shows faithful and useful work.

The Raleigh "baseball" team is again playing pennant-winning ball. Enthusiasm was never so great as yesterday. There were 1,500 people on the grounds.

Big Fire Loss.
LEXINGTON, Ky., June 7.—The Ochs cooper shop burned this evening and the fire communicated to other buildings so rapidly that it was feared for some time that the city would be laid in ashes. The fire was beyond control from 8 to 4 p. m. Twenty-three houses, mostly tenement, were totally destroyed with their contents. The loss approximately \$9,000. Only about one-third of the property was insured.

Many are homeless and were cared for tonight. Several children were seriously but not fatally burned. The fire originated in a negro's cottage from a defective box.

Terrific Cyclone.
GREENSBORO, La., June 7.—A terrific cyclone passed across the extreme north-west corner of this town late this afternoon and almost completely demolished the extensive buildings of the Ben. Lindsay Cotton Oil Mill, killed a white boy aged 14, named Albert Gonzalez, and seriously injured John Eades, a young white man, both of whom were employed there. The residence of W. B. Lewis, Willie Lewis, and Benjamin Lewis were demolished, and the Opelousas Hotel and Bowling Works damaged.
