McKinley Against Third Term. WASHINGTON, June 11.-President Mc Kinley today announced that he would not scept nomination for a third term

in the following statement: "I regret that the suggestion of a third term has been made. I doubt whether I am called upon to give it notice. But there are now questions of the gravest importance before the administration and the country and their just con-sideration should not be prejudiced in the public mind by even the suspicion of the thought of a third term.

"In view, therefore, of the reiteration of the suggestion of it I will say now, once for all, expressing a long settled conviction, that I not only am not and will not be a candidate for a third term. but would not accept a nomination for it if it were tendered me.

"My only ambition is to serve through my second term to the acceptance of my countrymes, whose generous confi-dence I so despiy appreciate, and then with them do my daty in the ranks of private citizanship.
