RALEIGH.

School Book Publishers Have Not Signed Contracts.

More Rain But Sunshine Needed. Seven Per Cent Increase in Planted Acreage of Cotton. Good Effect Compulsory Vaccination.

RALEIGH, June 14.—At the office of the State superintendent of public instruction it was said today that a great many inquiries are being received as to when the new school text books will be put on sale. The fact is the contracts have not yet been signed by any of the publishers and in consequence no arrangements are made for placing the books in dealers hands. There is to be at least one designated depository in each county and not over six such depositories in any one county. The publishers designate the depositories and make the arrangements with the local dealers. If any complaint is made that there is no dealer or agent, the State board has full authority to see that there is one.

Today the committee which has in charge the matter of passing upon the fish shell-fish commission claims returned home, taking with it the claims and will pass upon them at home. Senator Ward or the committee said he had no idea what the claims aggregated.

Heavy rain fell last night. None was needed. The farmers want all the sunshine possible to aid them in the most desperate fight they have ever had to make against grass. There are not a few abandoned cotton crops.

Assistant-Labor Commissioner Faison has gone to Buffalo as a representative of the Junior Order of American Mechanics from North Carolina. Four other delegates have gone from this State. L. C. Hewitt, C. A. G. Thomas, J. T. Tucker and A. B. Honey.

United States Marshal Dockery left for Nashville to-day, taking with him four federal prisoners to be placed in the penitentiary there. The number of convicts from North Carolina in this prison is now about 49.

The increase in the planted acreage of cotton this season was 7 per cent. Of course the cold weather and rains and grass have cut this down considerably, but the reduction will not be known until the June returns are received by the Agricultural Department. The blanks for these were sent out this week.

There are now 15 inmates of the small pox pest house near here. Two are from Raleigh Cotton Mills, some from Oberlin village and some from outlying townships. There were two cases in West Raleigh; a white merchant and his daughter. Eighty per cent of the people of Raleigh are vaccinated, as the result of compulsory vaccination.

SPECIAL SESSION LEGISLATURE.

Fayetteville Chamber Passes Resolutions Demanding Relief from Willard Tax Law.

Special to Journal. FAYETTEVILLE, June 14.—The following important resolutions have just passed the Fayetteville Chamber of Commerce:

"Whereas, we are informed by tax list experts and we ourselves believe that the existing Willard tax listing law is impracticable and incapable of execution, unjust, promotive of perjury and of innumerable litigation, unprecedentedly inquisitorial, and unconstitutional in spirit if not in letter.

Resolved, That the several Chambers of Commerce in North Carolina be requested to cooperate with us in an immediate appeal to the Governor to call a special session of the Legislature to amend the said act, or to take such other action as may relieve the present unfortunate situation."

The Cotton Crop.

New York, June 13.—Dispatches to Dun's Review from the entire cotton belt make a most satisfactory showing. Unfavorable weather conditions during the opening weeks of the season injured much of the seed and made replanting necessary. This adds to the cost of the crop, but does not prevent a full yield. There seems to be from 5 to 10 per cent. increase in the acreage under cultivation and while damage undoubtedly has been severe in some sections, fairly good weather from now to the beginning of picking would insure an abundant yield.

LONDON, June 13.—The Naval and Military Record, commenting on the three weeks' trial of the British turbine torpedo destroyer *Viper*, which was conducted under regular service conditions, and during which she developed a speed of 30 1/2 knots and was pronounced capable of doing 31, says her fuel consumption was enormous at top speed.

This, the paper adds, militates against the plan which the Dover-Calais Company is now maturing—to build two turbine channel steamers and reduce the time of crossing between England and France to 35 minutes.

The *Viper's* trial was pronounced to be completely satisfactory. Although she was handled by an inexperienced crew, she showed a remarkable immunity from breaking down. She was steady in all kinds of weather.
