PEAR PEARY IS LOST.

in North Greenland Was the Coldest Ever Known.

PHILADELPHIA, June 20.-The first news of the sesson from the far North was brought to this port yesterday by the Greenland bark Fluorine, from Ivigtut. The vessel left Greenland on May 21 for Philadelphia, and since that time has been buffeted by severe weather that is usually experienced at this time of the year. There were fears among the natives when the Fluorine left that Peary and his party of explorers had perished, as the winter in North Greenland had been one of the severest ever

For three months the mercury stood twenty degrees below zero, and hundreds of Esquimaux had perished from hunger of the Fluorine, reports that when he left Ivigtut the whaler Helene was ready to leave with supplies for the relief of the steamer Windward, which left St John's, Newfoundland, on June 18, 1900, with Mrs. Peary and her daughter, in search of her husband. It is feared that the coal supply on the Windward has run short, and the Helene was being hurriedly loaded. She was to have left for Drisco the same day that the Fluorine sailed for Philadelphia. The last heard can cheerfully recommend Peruna to from the Windward was in August last when she was at anchor in Melville Bay, several hundred miles north of Julians

When the Fluorine was off the New Jersey coast last Tuesday Thomas Anderson became insane and committed suicide by jumping overboard. The other vessels of the fleet are on their homeward runs and are expected daily.
