A NATION OF FARMERS.

The farming community, round about a city, when it is a thriving one, is a butwark of strength, commercially, to the city thus surrounded

Manufacturing plants add much to the prosperity of a place, but it is a question if manu actures equal farms in all the best effects, or give the city a growth as stable as that coming from an industrious farming community.

With all the growth of towns and cities, this country is still a nation of farmers, for the census returns of 1960 show that there were 5.700,000 farms under cultivation, against 4,564 691 in 1190.

Of this increase the Philadelphia Ledger says:

"This may be deemed a romarkable in-crease, showing that the growth of our industries is symmetrical, the farmers keeping pace in the march forward. The single discouraging feature of the situation is the increase of tenant farm-ing. This is is accounted for, however. to some extent by lease of lands by im-migrants who are intending purchasers. As the area of unoccupled arable lands in the United States becomes less and less, it is altogether probable that future consuses of the country will show a comparative decline in the number of farms. The heavy increase in the past ten years is in the nature of a surprise, though the inducements of fine crops and fair prices have doubtiess given a spur to land investments since 1896."


When she announced her intention to Mr. Perkins, his plendings and those of his family were made against another separation, and an early marriage was urged to take place in their home.

Pownsylvania Weasels. Possibly few who read of "kings robes of royal ermine" appreciate that the rightful and first possessors of the beauteous coat is sometimes a denized of the Keystone State. It may be that some subtle force suggested to turn coat monarchs to choose the pelt of this animal for their own. In fact, during the greater portion of the year the er mine is a plain egg sucking weasel. As winter comes on he assumes a white coat, with a black tinned tall.

Putolus noveboraccosis, as the scientist calls the weasel or ermine, ranges from North Carolina away up into Can ada. It is rare, however, to take ermine or white coated weasels in Penn sylvania, although two specimens have just been received at the Academy of Natural Sciences from Sullivan county In fact, south of Pennsylvania the wea sel never changes color in winter, and this fact goes far to substantiate the theory of protective coloration. Thus when snow covers the ground the whit ermine becomes nearly invisible, while in his weasel's guise during the sum mer he is not nearly so conspicuous as he would be did he wear his white cost all the year round.

Another interesting fact is that while the animals that live in the north al ways change color those in the south de not, the reason being that their white color would not protect, but destroy them, as there is almost no snow in the south .- Philadelphia Record.
