### SYMPATHIZER TARRED.

#### Insufficient Evidence to Make Incendiary Arrest.

**Declines Election. Foe. H. Hill and Daughter Judge Purnell Seriously Ill. Blanks For Public School Teachers. Made First Vice President.**

RALEIGH, June 27.—Some of the "sympathizers" of the striking machinists of the Seaboard Air-Line here night before last "tarred" one of the new men who came to replace the strikers. The tarring was done in a meadow near the company's shops.

Prof. W. J. Ferrell who was lately elected a member of the State board of public school examiners, declines the office, on account of his pressing duties. The board is to meet at Chapel Hill next Saturday.

Insurance commissioner Young left today for Edenton, to investigate a fire which is alleged to have been incendiary. He went to Dunn to make an investigation of an alleged incendiary fire but as the evidence was not sufficient to enable arrests to be made he is holding that case open.

Thos H. Hill, well known in this State as a poet, is critically ill at his home in Raleigh. Mrs. S. S. Batchelor, a daughter of Judge Thomas R. Purnell is also seriously ill, and her father was called from Writingsville here. The other daughters are trained nurses and those are with her, one having arrived from Lynchburg today.

Prof. Grissom, the state veterinarian of South Carolina is here and was a caller at the agricultural department today.

The State Superintendent of Public Instruction has prepared the blanks for certificates of public school teachers. These will be given after the July examinations. The first-grade certificate now runs for two years.

Among the arrivals here is Lieut. J. S. E. Young, U. S. A., of Henderson, recently home from Manila. He is to be married July 9, to Miss Daisy Stevenson of Henderson.

Other arrivals are: R. T. Carlyle, G. W. Hayes, Laurburg; F. P. Hobgood, Oxford; W. L. Grissom, Greensboro; Rev. Dr. J. D. Huffman, Henderson; Dr. Huffman is now on his way to the Tar River Baptist Association in this State, but was stopped here by the news of the sickness of his daughter.

Charles McCrery, a Marylander by birth, until lately one of the junior partners of the Carnegie Steel Company, has been made first vice-president and general manager of the Tennessee Coal and Iron Company, with headquarters at Birmingham. He has many friends in this State and one of these to day received this news.

#### Bids on Textile School.

RALEIGH, June 27.—The executive committee of the board of agriculture met again today to pass upon the bids for constructing the textile school at the Agricultural and Mechanical Colleges here. RALEIGH, June 27.—Ex-Senator Madison Butler has gone to New York to join Senator John F. Jones of Nevada, and they will leave Saturday for San Francisco, whence they will sail for Alaska. Butler is attorney for the Alaska Development Company of New York, of which Senator Jones is a director and large stockholder.

#### Nearly All the Volunteers Returned.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 26.—The arrival today of the transports Thomas and Hildford brings nearly all the volunteer army home from the Philippines. There are yet to arrive the Indiana, with the Forty-Second Regiment, and Ellipark, with the Forty-Third. There are now at the Presidio seven regiments awaiting muster out.

#### Hanna's Street Railway Raises Wages.

CLEVELAND, June 26.—The Cleveland City Railway Company, better known as the Little Consolidated System, of which Senator Hanna is president, announced today that the wages of all conductors and motormen who have been in the service of the company two years or more will be advanced, to take effect within a few days.

#### BANK FAILURE.

#### Seventh National Closes Its Doors. Rumored Stock-Exchange Firm In Trouble.

New York, June 27.—The Seventh National Bank, about which there have been rumors of trouble for several days, today closed its doors.

It was rumored that a big Stock-Exchange firm was in great trouble, and might have to suspend.

The announcement of the Seventh's closing started a sharp selling movement in stocks, with the tendency of prices downward.

According to the bank's last statement to the New York clearing house for the week ended June 23d, the Seventh National had a capital of \$378,000, net profits \$384,460; loans \$4,407,100; specie \$577,700; legal \$777,700; deposits \$5,718,400; circulation \$998,800.

According to the official statement covering the period up to the close of business on April 14, the government had \$310,883 on deposit with the bank, all postal funds, which is a fair average. To secure this the government held \$250,000 in bonds.

#### Appointed Commander.

RALEIGH, June 27.—Governor Aycock appoints William T. Old, of Elizabeth City, Commander of the North Carolina Naval Reserves, vice H. H. McIlhenny, of Wilmington, resigned.

#### Wages of Iron and Steel Workers Raised.

CLEVELAND, June 26.—The conference of the American Tin Plate Company's officials with representatives of the Amalgamated Association of Iron, Steel and Tin Workers, which has been in session here for several days past, has resulted in the signing of a new wage scale to go into effect July 1. The workmen asked for an advance of 3 per cent. Nearly 80,000 men, it is stated, will be benefited.

#### Navy Needs Sailors.

WASHINGTON, June 26.—Men are wanted for the enlisted force of the navy to complete the authorized strength of 25,000. The apprentice system is over 1,000 short and the regular establishment about the same number, with poor prospect of being fully recruited during the present summer. Over 900 sailors, whose terms of enlistment had expired, were discharged within the last three weeks from the Asiatic Station, and as each ship returns home its crew almost to a man will be discharged. At this rate the Navy Department finds it impossible to maintain the service at its full strength, although every recruiting station is active in enlisting men.

#### Changes in Encampment.

RALEIGH, June 27.—The change in the order in which the regiments will encamp at Camp Aycock, Writingsville, is very satisfactory. The 2d regiment encamps first because it is from the tobacco section, and many of its members are in the tobacco trade. July 10th it goes into camp, leaving on the 19th. The second regiment goes in on the 23d of July, and leaves on the 31st. The First regiment goes in August 5th, and leaves on the 14th, both days inclusion. As stated some weeks ago, the battery of artillery at Charlotte, which was recently made a full battery, will encamp with the First regiment.

The Rutherford Rifles, Co., L., 2d regiment, is disbanded for failure to comply with requirements.

#### 24,948 Filipinos Taken.

WASHINGTON, June 26.—The War Department has published a list of captures and surrenders in the Philippine Islands, supplementary to the list published on the 13th inst. The new list covers the period from April 15th to May 15th, 1901. During that period 21 officers and 2,491 men of the insurgent troops were captured and 483 officers and 5,889 men surrendered, making the total number of insurgents captured or surrendered up to May 15 last 27,948. There were surrendered together with 26,110 rounds of ammunition and 24 cannons.

#### Get Their Prize Money.

WASHINGTON, June 26.—Warriors were to day by the Treasury Department in favor of Rear-Admiral W. T. Sampson for \$2,300 and Capt. French E. Chadwick for \$950 for their share of prize money decreed them by the Court of Claims.

#### SECOND STORM RAGES.

#### Poconchos Said to Have Been Visited by Worse Downpour.

BLUEFIELD, W. VA., June 26.—A railroad operator has just received word from Poconchos, 15 miles west, that there has been a cloudburst and that water is three feet deep in the railroad yard and is washing property away.

ROANOKE, VA., June 26.—Word was received here at a late hour to-night confirming the report that there had been another heavy fall of rain in the West Virginia coal fields.

The intelligence received here says another storm has occurred and that Poconchos is damaged more than last Saturday. All railroad repairs are threatened.

COOPER, W. VA., June 26.—Heavy rain to night in the head of the Elkhorn has washed out much of the new work, and is likely to delay traffic to-morrow. The bridge on Mill creek, west of Cooper, is washed out.
