### ORCHARD AND GARDEN.

age should be given all through the early part of the growing season. Then mulch well before bot, dry weather Pear trees fequire rather less space

than any other fruit trees. Few of them are of a sprending habit, the mafority of them growing in a pyramidal form. Still, it is not best to allow them to grow too tall. Out out the tops. The drain of continual cropping is never noticed so particularly in an or-

chard until harvest time. The trees put forth blossoms, and the fruit that follows seems all right, but when the fruit ripens too many culls are found.
