RALEIGH.

Capital City Has Gone Crazy On Base Ball.

Chapel Hill Section Had in Crops. Bar Meeting a Success. Preliminary Hearing in Tyson Swindle Case.

RALEIGH, June 29.—The attorney General today completed the work of preparing the contracts for furnishing school text books at the prices fixed by the text book commission.

Ex-Congressman Strowd of Chapel Hill says the crops in that section are in the worst condition imaginable and that the farmers are in very bad plight. Cotton in this section looks better than it does in the west, but the corn in the west is much better than that here.

It is expected that the attendance at the base ball game here July 4 will break the Raleigh record. A lawn party is to be given in aid of the local team, which lost money by the failure of the Portsmouth and Newport News teams to play.

The lawyers and judges who attended the annual meeting of the Bar Association at Wrightsville say it was the best meeting yet held.

Rev. John C. Kilgo, president of Trinity College, is here to preach at Edenton Street M. E. church tomorrow a sermon as part of the exercises in memory of the late Robert O. Burton, Esq., who was one of the ablest lawyers in the State.

The preliminary hearing of T. B. Tyson and A. M. Waddell, both of Fayetteville, charged with swindling a Virginia life insurance company was held here today. Both were bound over to Superior Court.

Strike Trouble Abated.

Thacker, W. Va., June 28.—Quiet prevailed today in the coal fields of this section, where 2,000 miners are on strike for the recognition of the union. Though there has been constant dread of hostilities between the strikers and guards on duty at the collieries, nothing of the sort appears probable, as both sides have apparently settled down for a long struggle.

Citizens of Thacker and Matewan, together with Sheriff Hatfield and other county officials, fear the next chapter of the strike will be the declaration of a feud between the Daniels boys, of Kentucky, and the mine operatives. It is claimed the guards have fired at the Daniels in the hills of Kentucky opposite the mines, and that the former are certain to seek revenge.

Struck by Massachusetts.

GLOUCESTER, Mass., June 28.—The Portland fishing schooner Ella M. Doughty came into this port today considerably damaged and reported that she had been run down by the battleship Massachusetts off the South Shoal Lightship last night. The schooner had her bowsprit broken and her cutwater damaged and sustained other injuries to her rigging. Her captain does not blame the battleship, but instead praises the officers and crew for the prompt assistance which they gave him after the collision.

The accident occurred in a dense fog and in spite of the fact that both vessels were sounding frequent warnings.

No New Developments in Machinists' Strike.

NEW YORK NEWS, Va., June 28.—There is nothing new in the machinists' strike situation save a prevalent belief that the end is not far off and that some of the men are returning to work. The exact number cannot be learned. President Malachy, of the machinists, says three of his men went back this week. An important meeting of the strikers will be held tomorrow to consider the financial situation.

Co-Operation With Other Miners Secured.

WILLIAMSON, W. Va., June 28.—The strikers have added to their strength by securing the co-operation of the men at the Alma mine, who organized a union yesterday with seventy members. Today the strike leaders estimate that only 21 men are employed in all the mines in this field.

Minnesota Storm Swept.

ST. PAUL, Minn., June 28.—Heavy storms, with more or less damage, are reported all over this section this afternoon, and the loss will run well up into the thousands, while a number of people have been injured and much live stock killed.

The worst storm was that which passed through a large district south of New Richmond, Wisconsin. It was a genuine tornado and did much damage to farm property, but no lives were lost. On a smaller scale it resembled the tornado which swept over and destroyed the greater portion of New Richmond two years ago. Over a dozen farmers have already reported the loss of a part or all their buildings, windmills, live stock, machinery, etc., and the loss there will be heavy.

Our Army Finest in the World.

LONDON, June 28.—During the debate on the army re-organization bill in the House of Lords today, Lord Wolseley, the former commander-in-chief of the forces, declared that the United States army was the finest of its size in the world. He said its superiority was due to good wages. Great Britain must face the alternative of compensation or bonuses to secure recruits.

40,000 Will be Idle.

PITTSBURGH, June 28.—All the steel glass factories of the country operated under the scales of the American Flint Glass Workers' Union will close tomorrow night for periods ranging from four weeks to two months. Fully 40,000 men and boys will get the customary summer vacation.

The longest shutdown is in the prescription bottle branch, where the 2,000 skilled workers will be idle for two months. The suspension in the chimney glass branch is for six weeks and in the ground-glass branch is for four weeks. Many of the non-union plants will also close, which will greatly increase the number of idle workers next month.
