Powerful Mission For Cannon Balls.

The authorities at one of the British naval arsenals were rather surprised recently by an inquiry as to whether they had any old cannon balls for sale, 14 and 28 pounders, such as Nelson used at Trafalgar. It turned out that they were required by the owner of a Welsh slate quarry. When a large slab of stone has to be detached, a slit is opened behind it and small cannon balls dropped in. The workmen then "joggle" the partly loosened block to and fro with their crowbars, and at every movement the cannon balls drop deeper. Very soon larger balls can be inserted, and then the whole block falls forward completely severed.—Cardiff Western Mail.

They will be welcomed by the many who had the high stiff band of linen a veritable instrument of torture in hot weather and who object to the substitution of a lace tie as not sufficiently protecting the delicate skin of the throat from the sun's rays.

Handkerchiefs in Paris.

There are two kinds of handkerchiefs called in French "mitre." "Mitre" means a handkerchief between the very dressy one and the everyday pocket handkerchief.

First of all draw some graceful lines upon the colored batiste to work upon, and place it upon some very thick paper or upon oiled cloth (oil cloth is preferable), then work on these made lines a small stitch with twist. The border of the handkerchief is scalloped with a larger stitch.
