Siberian Crops Fail.

LONDON, July 21 .- A dispatch to the Evening Standard from Odessa says that according to the reports of special agents the Siberian crops appear to be nearly a total failure.

In the great grain producing regions of Hinussinsk and Krasnoyarsk almos the entire growth of cereals has per ished as a result of two months' drouth The conditions are almost equally de plorable in the Krasno-Oofimsk, Kimgursk, Ossiusk, Ocausk, Solikamsk Solikamak, Perm and Schadrinsk regions, where such a hot and dry summe has not been known in 40 years.

The South Russian crop may be de cribed, upon the whole, as average, ye there are disastrous shortages in the populous districts in the Eksterinosisfi government. An instance is cited of the utter destruction of about 40,000 acres of grain by hallstorms and the Hessian fly. The same agencies have blighted large tracts of grain in the Paurids and Don country, and in the Souban and Terek districts, in Northern
