NEW BERN AS A SUMMER RE-SORT.

For the past two weeks the newspaper reports record maximum temperatures ranging from 93 to 108 degrees, in the cities north, west and south.

And during this same period the mans imum temperature iu New Bern was 89 degrees, and this only on one day, the average temperature being near 8J de-

This exemption from savere high temperatures, just now, is not an ordinary one for New Bern, for there are few days at any time in the year when the heat is unbearable and such records as are now being made at many points are unknown here.

The proximity of numerous rivers and large bodies of water in doubtless the cause of our equable temperature and the long-reaches of pine forests have a modifying influence on the climate. Whatever the reason may be, the result is satisfactory to the citizens who may make this their home.


