KEEPS SILENT.

The Surety Company Not Refused to Pay Martin's Shortage.

Quarantine Against Horrae Had Men Caught. Eight White Orphanages in State. Strikers make Statement.

NEW BERN, N. C., July 26.—Ex-Treasurer Worth said today that the surety company of Baltimore in which W. H. Martin was bonded to him had not decided to pay the amount of Martin's shortage, that it did not answer letters, but remains silent. He said, "I called for certain papers. We sent them. Then it asked for others. We have given all that asked for. Since then nothing has been heard from it."

The Atlantic Coast Line to day paid with the State Treasury \$84,890.07, being the tax due the State on the \$18,938,000 at which the road was assessed by the corporation commissioners.

The commission of agriculture today received a letter from the chairman of the board of commissioners of Mecklenburg county, saying glanders is raging among horses in York county, S. C., which adjoins Mecklenburg, and asking that Mecklenburg desire to have quarantine until the disease subsides or is stamped out. In reply the commission gives authority to quarantine any horses or mules which may be shipped into Mecklenburg from the section in South Carolina in which said animals are imported with glanders or been exposed to infection from the disease.

Last night a house breaker was caught here, after he had made threats against the life of a young man on a railway track near the penitentiary. All kinds of property he had stolen was found on him. Today he was sent to the road for 30 days. At the end of that time (if he does not escape) he will be held in \$50 for carrying a concealed weapon and in \$300 for house breaking.

There are now in this State eight white orphanages, these being the Masonic, at Oxford; Baptist at Thomasville; Presbyterian at Baytown Springs; Thompson (Episcopalian) at Charlotte; Friends at High Point; Old Fellows at Goldsboro; Roman Catholic and Methodist at Raleigh. Even these do not have room for all applicants.

John L. Scarborough says there are 600 hospital children in the State now who ought to be in an orphanage.

The Board of State ex-strikers here say very frankly that the road made them no concession and that they lost the strike. They say if strikers at all the other shops had held out like they did here they would not have lost.

The State superintendent of public instruction directs that in future superintendents of graded schools must report to him annually.

THE HEAT CONTINUES.

Slim-Dry and Hot in the Corn Belt. Water becoming Scarce.

WASHINGTON, July 26.—Weather bureau's official reports show that the corn belt region continues hot and dry, with no prospects of immediate change in these conditions. Showers have fallen in the northern half of the corn belt area since last night, including eastern Nebraska, Iowa, northern Illinois, northern Indiana and Ohio. Most of these rains, which generally were light in amount, fell last night. Today there were some light rain falls in western Nebraska and Oklahoma.

These slight precipitations, however, the forecast officials say, are not always conducive to the best results to the growing crops, as they are mostly thunder showers, immediately followed by a hot sun.

Temperatures in the corn belt, while a few degrees lower today than yesterday were again high, ranging from 86 degrees to 100 and higher. Nebraska, Kansas and Missouri, the latter particularly, are greatly in need of rain, the other states of the corn belt, including Iowa, Nebraska and northern Illinois having had some rainfall, though generally very light in amount.

Senator McLaurin Ruled Out.

Columbia, S. C., July 25.—The State executive committee, late tonight, adopted a resolution ruling Senator McLaurin out of the Democratic primary. The action was totally unexpected. Senator Tillman supported the resolution which was unexpectedly offered as a substitute for a resolution over which there had been much debate, presenting the oath to be taken by candidates for Congress in the approaching election to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Congress man Stokes, of the seventh district. The rules proposed in that resolution were plainly intended to cover the senatorial election next year. The resolution follows:

"Whereas, The Hon. John L. McLaurin, Jr., elected to represent the State of South Carolina in the national Congress, has by his admissions and votes in that body, ignored the national Democratic platform and thereby misrepresented his State and its Democratic constituency who elected him, therefore be it

"Resolved, That it is the sense and conviction of the State Democratic executive committee that Senator McLaurin, from the standpoint of honesty and self-respect, should render his unqualified resignation immediately."

The resolution is adopted by a vote of 28 to 6.

NEW CHARTERS.

Names of Cotton Mills. Number of Furniture Factories.

Raleigh, July 26.—To this date this year the State has chartered the following cotton mills: Tarboro, Enfield and Raleigh Hosiery (knitting); CHHALE, Lockland, Piedmont, Charlotte, Louisa, Chronicle, Elizabeth, Mary-Bitt, Scotland Neck, Lenoir, Cameron and Hart-Granite, fifteen in all. This shows that there is but little abatement in the building of mills in North Carolina.

Up to date this year twelve charters have been granted to furniture factories, and this shows extensive development of this important business. The charters were to the Dixon, Pilot, Bell and Harris, Gate City, Burlington, Tomlinson, Warrenton, Victor, Forest, Greensboro, National and Mockeville companies.

A charter is granted the Greensboro brick, tile and pipe company; capital \$25,000.

Falling Vision Inevitable.
