For week ending Monday, August 12, 1901.—The past week was characterized by very heavy rains from Monday to Wednesday, Industive, which were fol-Charlotte, Aug. 18.—Charlotte de-leated Raleigh today, game called at end at sighth. Inning on account of rain. lowed by fair, worm and favorable weather. The rainfall averaged nearly 1.00 above the normal, but was very beneficial in nearly all the counties of eastern district, along the northern bor-der of the State, and in the extreme west, where the drought was generally broken and crops materially improved; in the southern portion, however, the utnal term of Greene county court is beavy rains washed cotton, and corn lands badly in some localities, and re-sulted in heavy freshets with overflow of lowlands and some damage to stack ed hay and other crops.
